
Discover world of treasures at the library this summer

'Under the Sea' is the theme and the Summer Reading Clubs will soon be underway. In addition to the reading clubs, the library is also offering a series of drop-in family story times and special Wednesday programs for children over the summer, and you don't need to be in the reading clubs to participate.

There are three different reading clubs for children. The 'First Mates Club' invites 3 to 5-year-olds to share books with their parents. By keeping track of what library books are read through the season, children can qualify for a prize. Children who are 6 to 10 are invited to join the '20,000 Reads Under the Sea Club'. Those who join get a nautical poster and log book to record their reading adventures. Each report given at the library will lead to points and prizes are awarded at various levels. The club members are encouraged to come to the free launch party featuring magi-



cian Owen Anderson. The 'Cabin Crew Club' is for those aged 11 and over. Each report the 'Crew members' hand in over the summer gains a ballot for a chance for prize winning at the end of summer Pizza Party.

Each club will wrap up with an end of summer party. The First Mates will do Clifford the Big Red Dog activities at their party, while the 20,000 readers and the Cabin Crew will feature draws for great ocean treasures such as an underwater camera, beach towels, flippers and more!

While the reading clubs should keep the sailors busy through the summer months, the library is also offering special Wednesday afternoon program. From mid-July through August children can sign up to attend book theme parties featuring popular kids' series.


