

Bacteria sufferers E being hit financially

Lewanne DeBaie had big plans for this Christmas. She was going to visit her three-year-old niece, who lives in British Columbia.

Although this might not sound particularly important, it is to Ms DeBaie. Her sister passed away just three months ago, leaving her niece motherless.

Now, after becoming ill with E. coli and being unable to work for a couple of weeks, Ms DeBaie's plans are in jeopardy because she simply doesn't know if she'll be able to afford the trip.

Suddenly, B.C. seems further away than

"Not working is going to set me back from doing the things I want to do," said Ms DeBaie, 19.

She isn't alone. Ms DeBaie is one of many E.C. Drury students who are sick of being sick from the recent E. coli outbreak, and even sicker of losing much-needed wages.

As the number of reported E. coli cases increases — as of yesterday afternoon 85 students had reported being sick — so too does the collective number of work hours lost by students as well as the number of plans altered or dashed completely.

What began as a milestone celebration at Trillium Banquet and Convention Centre in Mississauga — possibly the source of the food poisoning — has turned out to be an unexpected nightmare.

Of the 250 people who attended the June 25 graduation party — one less than originally thought — Halton's Medical Officer of Health Dr. Bob Nosal said 225 have been contacted. Of those, 85 students are reporting symptoms like bloody diarrhea.

The bacteria strain has been confirmed by tests to be E. coli 0157:H7, the same kind that killed seven people in Walkerton via tainted drinking water.

Given that the incubation period for getting ill has come and gone, Dr. Nosal doesn't expect the number of sick people to
