## Young swimmer to attempt Lake Ontario crossing

Highly-determined teen confident about his chances of covering 51km

regg Taylor hit the water almost immediately after hitting the world.

In the pool at a mere two weeks of age
— and rarely dry for long periods since
then — he simply can't envision his life
without swimming.

Now the 19-year-old pool shark is ready to take the ultimate plunge — a Lake Ontario crossing attempt slated for August 13.

The oldest grandchild of local swimming guru Carole Murray, Mr. Taylor seems awfully confident in his chances of taming the 51 kilometres between Niagara-on-the-Lake and Toronto.

But then spending one's life in water will do that.

"I know I can complete it," said the softspoken but self-assured teen, who spent last summer working at his grandmother's "They key is to not kill myself in the first 100m.

Should Mr. Taylor cross successfully, he'll be the youngest person to ever do so — eclipsing an age mark set a decade ago by 20-year-old Carlos Costa. However, Lake Ontario's potential conqueror has an even bigger incentive driving him.

happens to be yours, but names age. I couldn't imagine a baby with my name, for example.


