## Ice cream perfect end to any summer meal

This week's recipe is ideal for summer entertaining. It can be made well in advance and kept frozen until you need a perfect dessert to conclude your outdoor meal — and who doesn't like ice cream? Enjoy!

#### Ice Cream Dessert

2 cups flour

1/2 cup oatmeal

1/2 cup brown sugar

1 cup chopped pecans

1 cup melted butter or margarine 2 litres vanilla ice cream

1 jar caramel or chocolate ice cream

topping

Mix flour, oatmeal, sugar and



chopped pecans in a bowl. Add melted butter and mix well. Spread on a cookie sheet and bake at 400 degrees F. for 15 minutes. (Watch it doesn't burn.)

Let cool and crumble. Press half of the mixture in a 9x13 greased pan. Drizzle half of the ice cream topping over the base. Cut up the ice cream and layer on top. Top with remaining crumbs and drizzle the rest of the topping over the top. Cover with plastic wrap and freeze well before serving.

Over the past three months, various bars throughout Ontario have been hosting NewMediaStar.tv regional singing competitions.


They've each chosen several finalists to sing in the final showdown, with a lot at stake — the winner will receive a TV appearance, music video and CD release opportunities.



### WATERMAIN CLEANING PROGRAM FOR 2003

Attention Residents of Milton on the Municipal Well-Based Water Distribution System

With the commissioning of the manganese filtration system at the Kelso Wells Pumping Station effective June 17, 2003, the Environmental Services Division of Halton Region's Planning and Public Works Department, and our contractor will be cleaning the watermains in the Milton well-based water distribution system commencing the week of July 13, 2003. The 2003 Watermain Cleaning Program represents the final phase in resolving issues of discoloured water in Milton. This work will continue for approximately 6 weeks.

When we are on your street or in your neighbourhood we regret that there may be some unavoidable inconvenience related to the cleaning process. In particular, discoloured water can result from the cleaning process, and to avoid having it enter your home/place of business please follow the steps noted below:

Do not use water between the times indicated on your blue letter, which we will provide to you approximately 2 days prior to working on your street.

When we are finished for the day on your street (times indicated in the blue letter) please turn on the cold water tap in your basement and let it run until the water is clear.

To keep informed of our progress, check the advertisements in this newspaper again and look for our blue letter in your mailbox for the dates we'll be working on your street.
