



## So far no great risk for humans: Region

The mosquitoes found belong to the Culex species — known to feed off birds. So far, there's no great risk of humans

contracting the disease, said Mr. Dickhout. He noted that if the risk increases, the community will be notified and advised to

take extra precautions. Mr. Dickhout added that people should continue to be aware of West Nile and try

to avoid unnecessary exposure to mosqui-"Avoid areas with high mosquito popula-

tion, wear repellent with DEET and report all dead bird sightings," he said. The area where the bird and mosquitoes

tested positive will undergo the third stage of larviciding beginning Monday. Larviciding doesn't harm the environ-

ment and has been successful at sites where it has been conducted, according to the health department.

"The larvicides have been successful in

areas with standing water," Mr. Dickhout noted.

"But, we cannot forecast the long-term success."

Because West Nile is relatively new to the area, there isn't yet enough data to make any long-term judgments about the future of the virus, he said.

"We're collecting data all the time, researching data and sharing data with other municipalities and areas to learn as much as we can," said Mr. Dickhout.

time," he said. "It's likely due to drowning."

Det. Sgt. Cousens said the family is devastated by the tragedy.

"We can't be judgmental here," he said. "Everybody has to look out for your children, particularly when around water and other hazardous locations because seconds count. It's too bad this young life was lost."

Det. Sgt. Cousens said police spoke to

the Town about looking into whether the fishpond meets bylaw requirements.

Town clerk Tory McHarg said bylaw officers visited the site yesterday morning and found that the pond is in compliance with bylaws and doesn't require a fence to be erected around it.

The campground owners refused to comment on the incident.
