Only three of the 12 transformers that provide Milton power were operating by 10 a.m. this morning.

Town of Milton CAO Mario Belvedere said he didn't know how many households were with or without power.

But he said Milton District Hospital and the Kelso well field, which provide vital services, had regular power and were operating like they normally do as of press

Mr. Belvedere said Hydro One the provincial agency that provides

power to Ontario's municipalities is working diligently to get everything back on line as soon as possi-

"(Milton) seems to be lagging behind a bit in getting full power," Mr. Belvedere said, adding he doesn't know when those without power will regain it.

However, he noted the power supply restored in certain places will be erratic this afternoon as Hydro One works to get electricity fully restored.

Town Hall is closed today and all recreational and leisure programs are canceled due to the power problem.

Mr. Belvedere said the sewage treatment plants in the region were working normally as of 10 a.m.

"Sewage plants are fine and operationally stable."

The power loss means some residents' well pumps aren't working. Residents can get safe drinking water at the following locations the Region's operations centre at Steeles Avenue and Hwy. 401 and in Campbellville on Jessie Road. Also, there's no GO Train service today but GO is running buses.

there were more calls received than usual. Mike Kingston, acting deputy chief, said there were actually fewer collisions than normal.

The Milton police station was able to fully operate with a generator.

"We had more than sufficient officers to handle potential issues," Dep. Chief Kingston said.

There were a few minor cases of trouble in town.

"There were some calls of kids roaming around, overturning pots, so there was a bit of mischief. There were some extra domestics and some

assaults, but it was a quiet night," he said. "By the end of the night, we were mainly just wandering around."

He added that the police department is continuing to stand guard, anticipating rolling blackouts later today.

He said Milton District Hospital has power.

There were unconfirmed reports of people trapped in elevators but that couldn't be confirmed at press time.

Most of the fire department's calls overnight were for alarm activations.
