

Man threatens resident with knife, no one hurt

Police laid a number of charges Sunday night after a Bronte Street man was threatened with a knife.

Police arrived at the victim's Bronte Street residence just after 9:40 p.m.

The 22-year-old man had been followed into the home by a man who brandished an X-Acto knife and uttered threats, police said.

Charged with possessing a weapon dangerous to the public peace, break and enter and uttering death threats is a 39-year-old Wasaga Beach man.

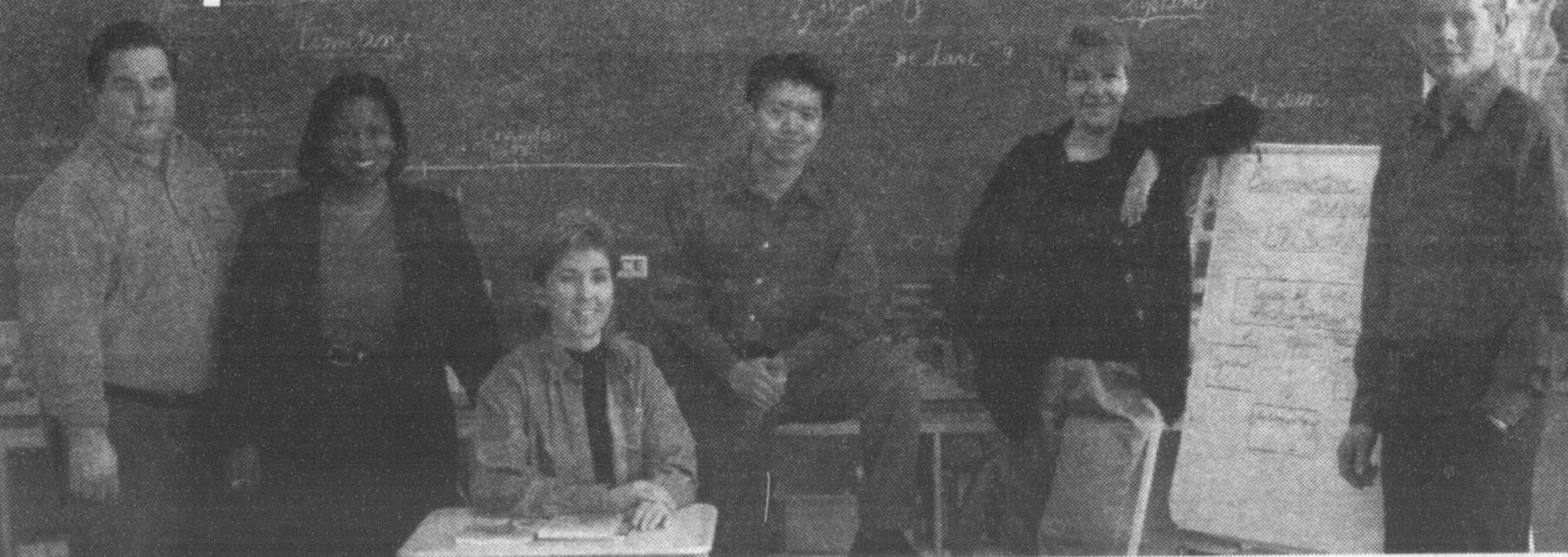

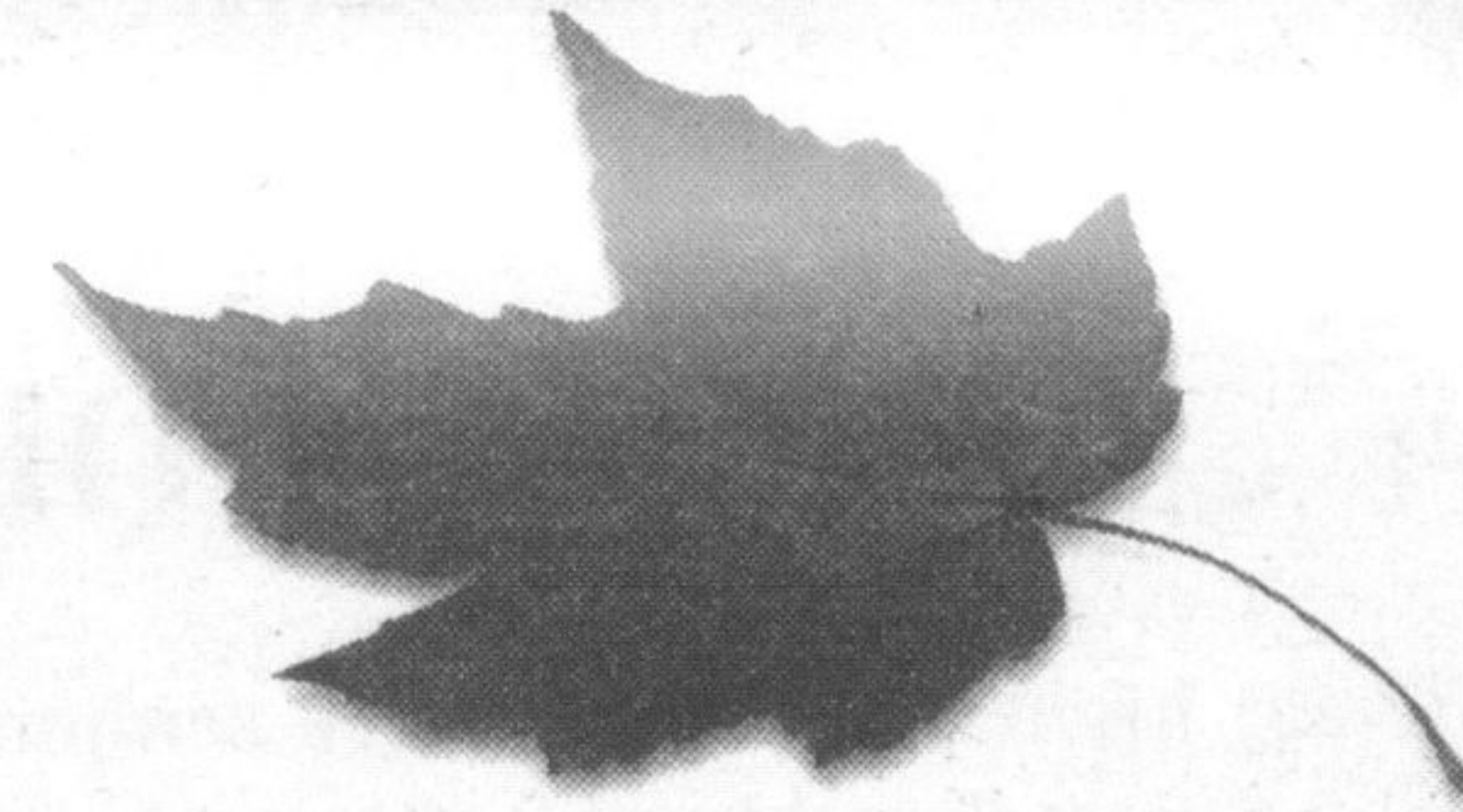

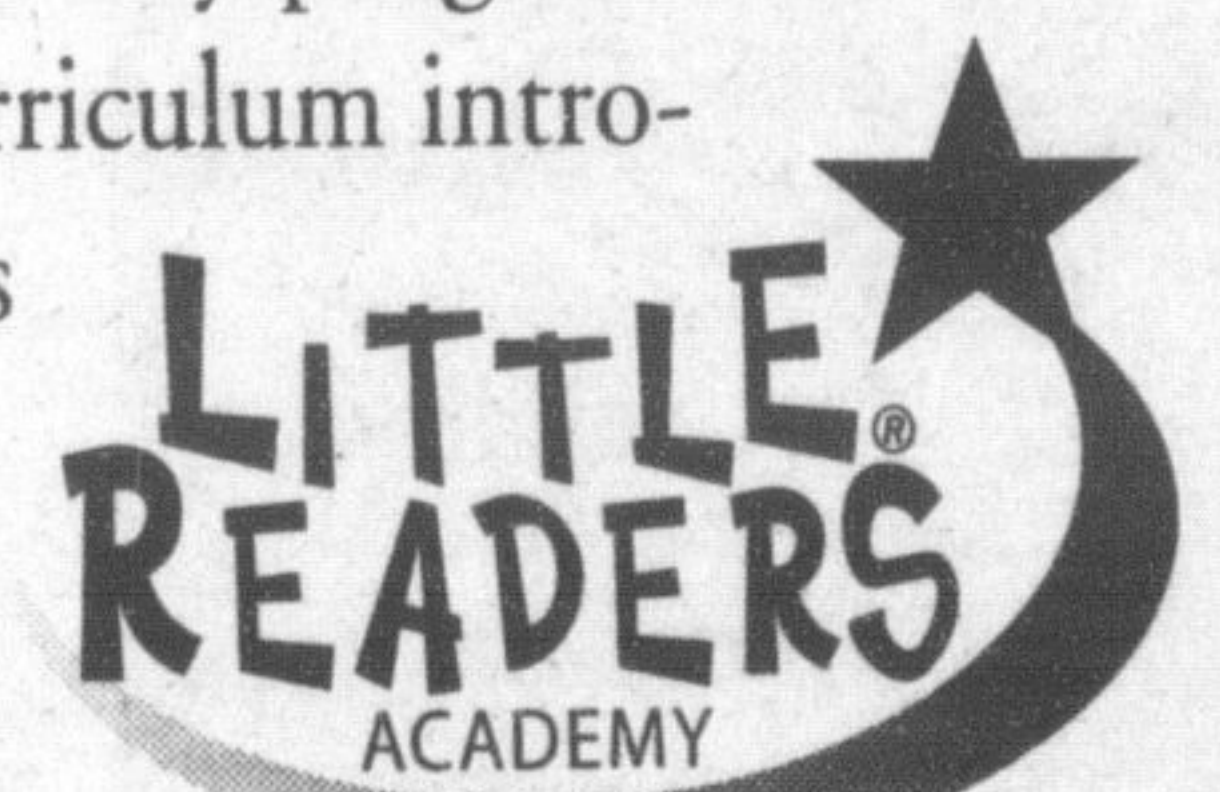
