But sniper not deterred by move



arren Haydar got a small taste of NHL competition last year and is quite confident about his chances to enjoy a more generous serving this coming season.

Despite being sent back to the AHL Milwaukee Admirals Tuesday afternoon, Milton's electrifying winger says he's ready to make a bigger impact with Nashville. Said the 23-year-old sniper, "Last year I was just happy to be there (in two games with the Predators). Now it's time to get something done."

Haydar did just that in his NHL pre-season debut last Friday — potting two firstperiod goals to help sink the host Chicago Blackhawks 5-0. "That was definitely a confidence booster," he said.

While reassigned to Milwaukee four days later — along with fellow forwards Greg Claessen, Mathieu Darche and Mike



Vince, Catch 22 second in Newmarket

Ainsley Vince has been part of far too many dramatic finishes in high-stakes equestrian competition to be fazed by one more.

So Milton's 27-year-old show jumping ace can be excused if she wasn't overly emotional about a nail-biting defeat at the hands of France's Yann Candele Sunday afternoon at Newmarket's Tournament of Champions.

Aboard long-time partner Catch 22, Vince looked poised to take top honours in the \$75,000 World Cup Qualifier's nine-horse jump-off negotiating a particularly challenging oxer turn in expert fashion and stopping the clock in a brisk 41.103 seconds.

Moments later, her French adversary and

Millcreak Marco Taere tamed the twisty Pierre Jolicoeudesigned course half-a-second faster to finish first.

"There were a couple of others who went clean for a second time, so I knew it could be done. He just took the turn a little quicker. That's show jumping," said Vince Monday.

The local show jumper did enjoy a mighty favourable consolation prize Sunday. Along with the \$16,500 that went with it,


second place allowed her to cement the two-event

Canada Cup final points championship. Accompanying the series win is a one-year lease of a brand new Mercedes.

Newmarket represented the latest chapter in what's been another storied season for the twotime national champion.
