2003 MUNICIPAL AND SCHOOL BOARD ELECTIONS NOTICE TO ELECTORS - APPOINTMENT OF VOTING PROXY

If you are entitled to be an elector in the Town of Milton and are unable to vote on November 10, 2003 or at one of the advance voting dates (November 1 or November 5, 2003 at the Milton Mall), you may appoint another qualified elector as a voting proxy to vote on your behalf. To vote by proxy, your name must be on the voters' list or it must have been added to the list by revision. The following conditions apply to proxy voting:

A person wishing to appoint a proxy must do so on the prescribed form and the person appointed must bring the form to the Clerk's Office in person;

The name of the elector appointed must be filled in prior to the elector making the appointment signing the form;

Proxy appointments may be made from October 3, 2003 to November 10, 2003 from 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. each day or November 1 and November 5 from 12 noon to 5 p.m. at the Clerk's Office;

The person appointed must be an eligible elector in the Town of Milton;

A person appointed as a proxy may only act for one person who is not a relative, **OR** can act as proxy for one or more relatives (parent, grandparent, child, grandchild, brother, sister or spouse or same-sex partner);

The person you have appointed as proxy may still vote in his/her own right at the appropriate voting place.

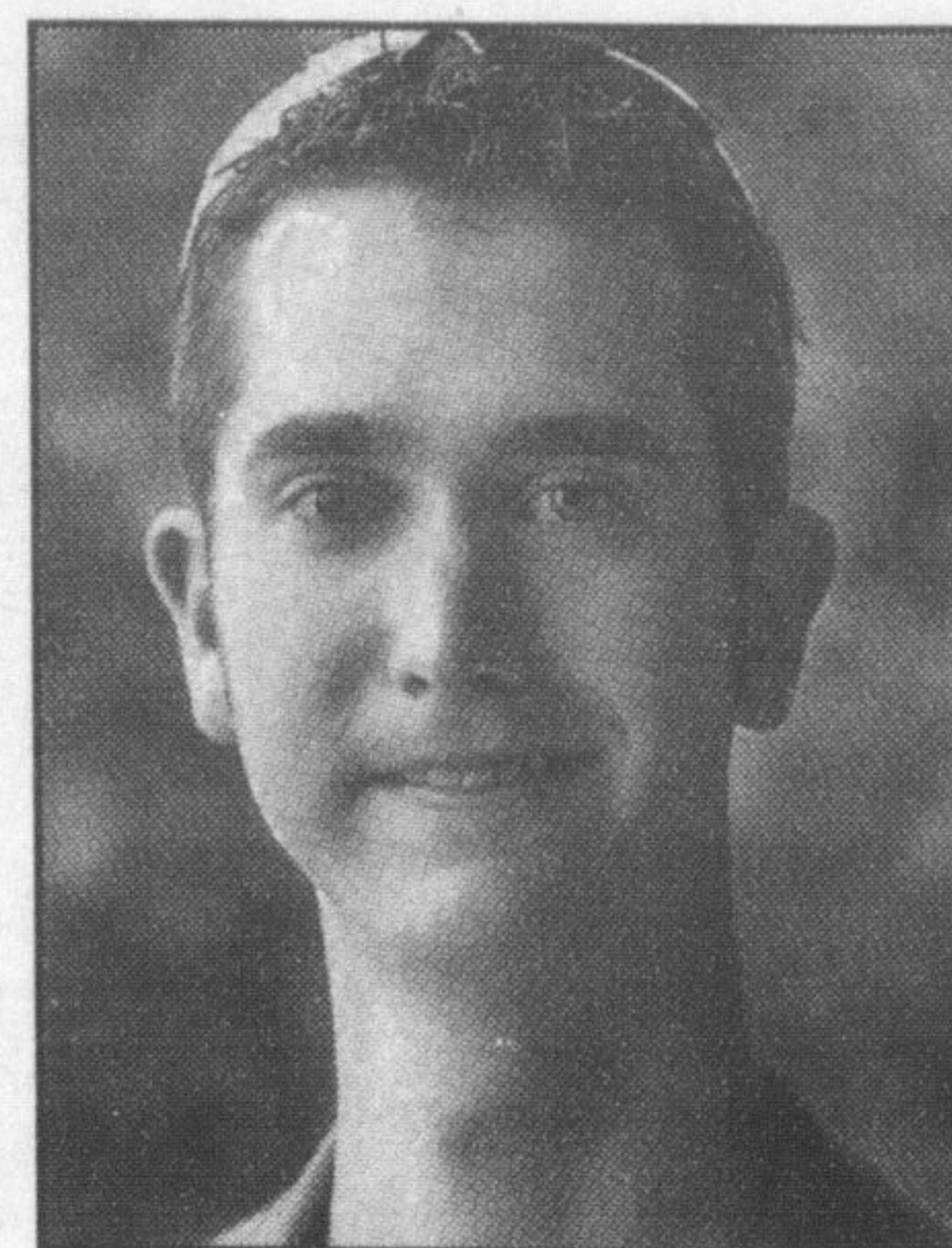

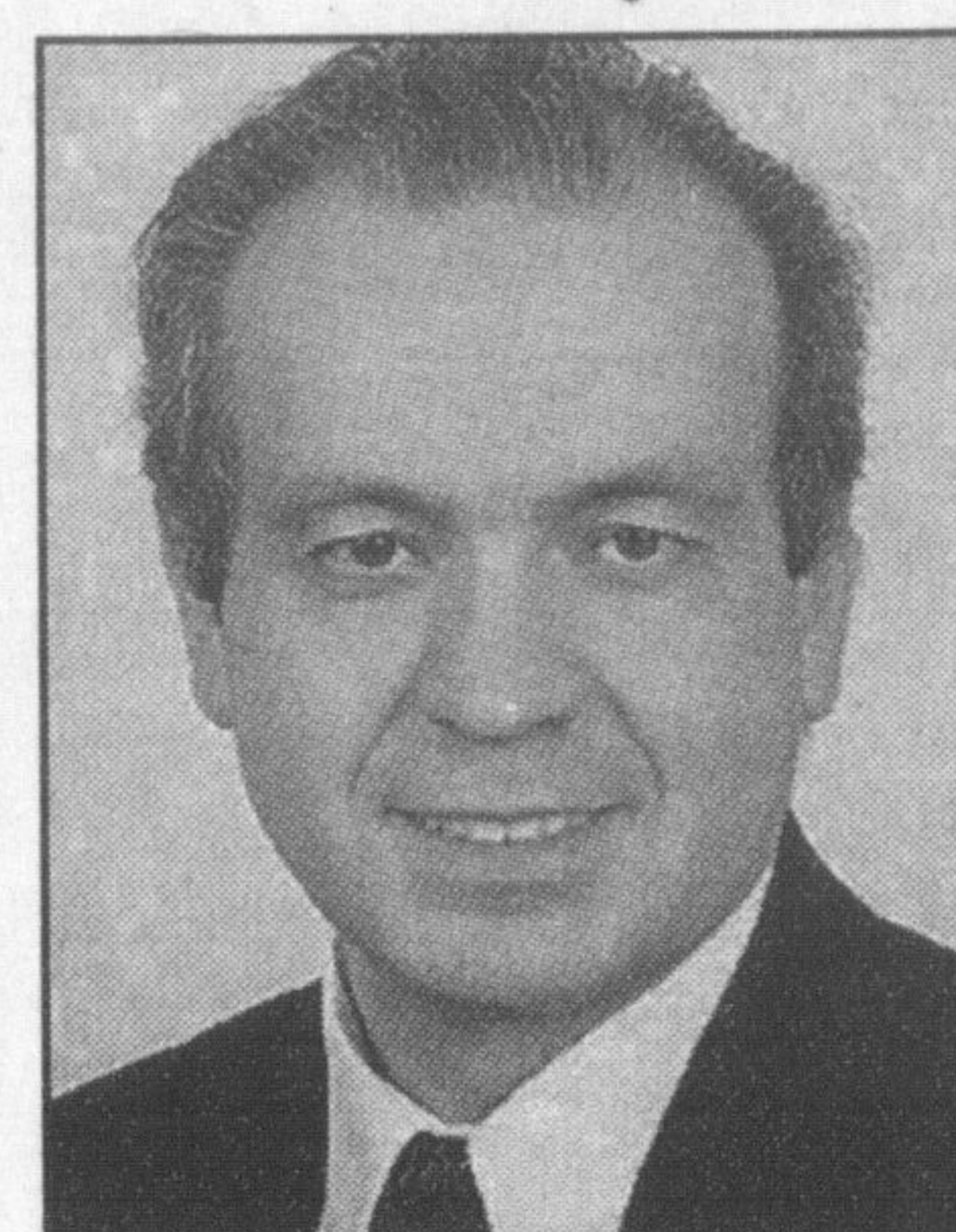

Family Coalition, Green say they're making progress

Although they finished in fourth and fifth place respectively, both the Halton Green Party and Family Coalition Party (FCP) candidates said last night they're pleased with their results.

Matt Smith, a 19-year-old Oakville resident who represented the Green Party locally, was happy to see support for his party grow from 806 votes (or 1.4 per cent of the vote) in 1999 to 1,295 votes (or 1.9 per cent).

"I feel pretty good for running a campaign without a single sign on the road," said Mr. Smith.

He added he's also a student and ran the campaign on his own.

"I've gotten so many e-mails and I think the Green Party has grown so much."

He said many people told him they would vote for him and they wanted the PCs out of office.

Giuseppe Gori of the Family Coalition Party said he was quite pleased with his party's showing in Halton as well as across the province.

"The important thing is we had more candidates and we had more votes," said Mr. Gori, the party's Halton candidate and leader of the FCP of Ontario.

"The important thing for us is to grow."

Mr. Gori earned 1,124 votes, or 1.6 per cent of the vote, in Halton yesterday compared to 755 votes, or 1.38 per cent, in 1999.

Mr. Gori said he wanted to congratulate PC candidate Ted Chudleigh on his win.
