# Charges laid in connection with thefts from companies

Charges have been laid after two industrial supply companies were broken into.

On October 1, Primary Electrical Supply on Steeles Avenue West was broken into and three coils of cable worth \$3,410 were taken.

E.C. Drury Secondary School was broken into sometime between last Friday and Monday.

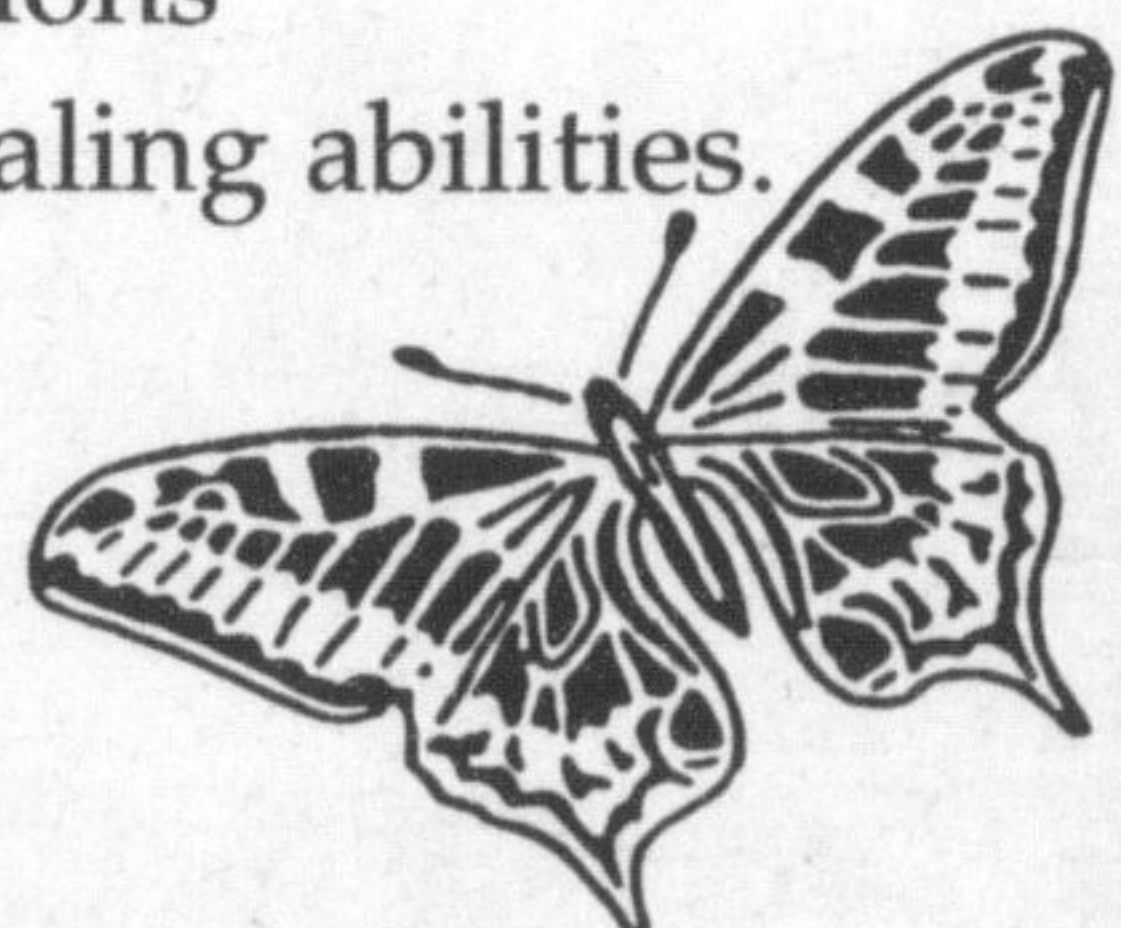
Unknown suspects smashed a window to gain entry and took a money box and stereo valued at about \$700.
