

## Hunt on for photos of those killed in the First World War

Starting a search 85 years late is

The First World War ended in 1918 and now The Champion is joining forces with the Milton Historical Society and the Royal Canadian Legion in the search for photos of the 68 men listed on the Milton and Nassagaweya -monuments in Victoria Park and Haltonville.

It's part of a "remembering" project undertaken as a tribute to "the men we never knew."

As part of the historical society's research program, Councillor John Challinor has tracked down as much detail as official records can provide.

> The result is a major document that needs photos of the men to add to the details so they may speak with faces to future generations. The hunt is on for photos of the men, preferably but not necessarily, in uniform.

> The historical society published "Milton Remembers World War II," written by Ken Lamb in 1995. It contains photos of those killed in the Second World War from the Victoria Park cenotaph. This project is an attempt to complete the record.

Photos, which are loaned, will be scanned and the original returned unless the lender prefers that the original be kept by the historical society archives, Legion Hall of Remembrance or Halton Region Museum Archives.

Several photos have been located and loaned out by individuals, but many more are needed.
