BDC Young Entrepreneur Awards

The highlight of Small Business Week is the presentation of the Business Development Bank of Canada Young Entrepreneur Awards. These awards are given to thirteen entrepreneurs, one from each province and territory, between the ages of 19 and 35. Winners are selected on the basis of their outstanding business achievements, innovative spirit and community involvement.

BDC's Ongoing Achievement Award

This year, a new award is being offered for the first time: BDC Ongoing Achievement Award. The award will be presented to one of the winners of the Young Entrepreneur Awards between 1988 and 2002 whose company has shown sustained growth since the entrepreneur won the award. This award, presented by the BDC consulting Group, comes with a \$20,000 grant. The winner will also get a free Growth Potential Assessment from the BDC Consulting Group. This consulting service, valued at \$5,000, provides a detailed profile of the company's strengths and areas requiring improvement, and includes a written report on the business' ability to meet the challenges of future growth as well and advice on increasing profitability.
