

Photos sought of those fallen in WWI

Some of the "men we never knew" who were killed during the early months of the First World War died in April 1915.

Four from the Milton-Nassagaweya area died on the same day, April 23, 1915.

The oldest was 35 and the youngest was 22.

Among them was Capt. Alfred C. Bastedo, who led the first volunteers from this area.

Stanley Adamson, 26, died on the Western front in Northern France; Alfred Bastedo, 29, died in the Battle of Langemarck, Belgium; Wm. Lees, 22, was killed at Ypres, Belgium; and W. Slack, 35, died in the second Battle of Ypres.

The Champion, Milton Historical Society and Royal Canadian Legion are co-operating in the search as part of a "remembering project" for photos of the 70 men listed on the cenotaphs at Victoria Park in Milton and Haltonville in Nassagaweya.

Details of their war careers has been compiled from official records but pictures are needed to re-introduce them to current and future generations.

Photos, which are loaned, will be scanned and the originals returned unless the lenders prefer that the originals be kept by the Milton Historical Society Archives, Legion Hall of Remembrance or Halton Region Museum Archives.

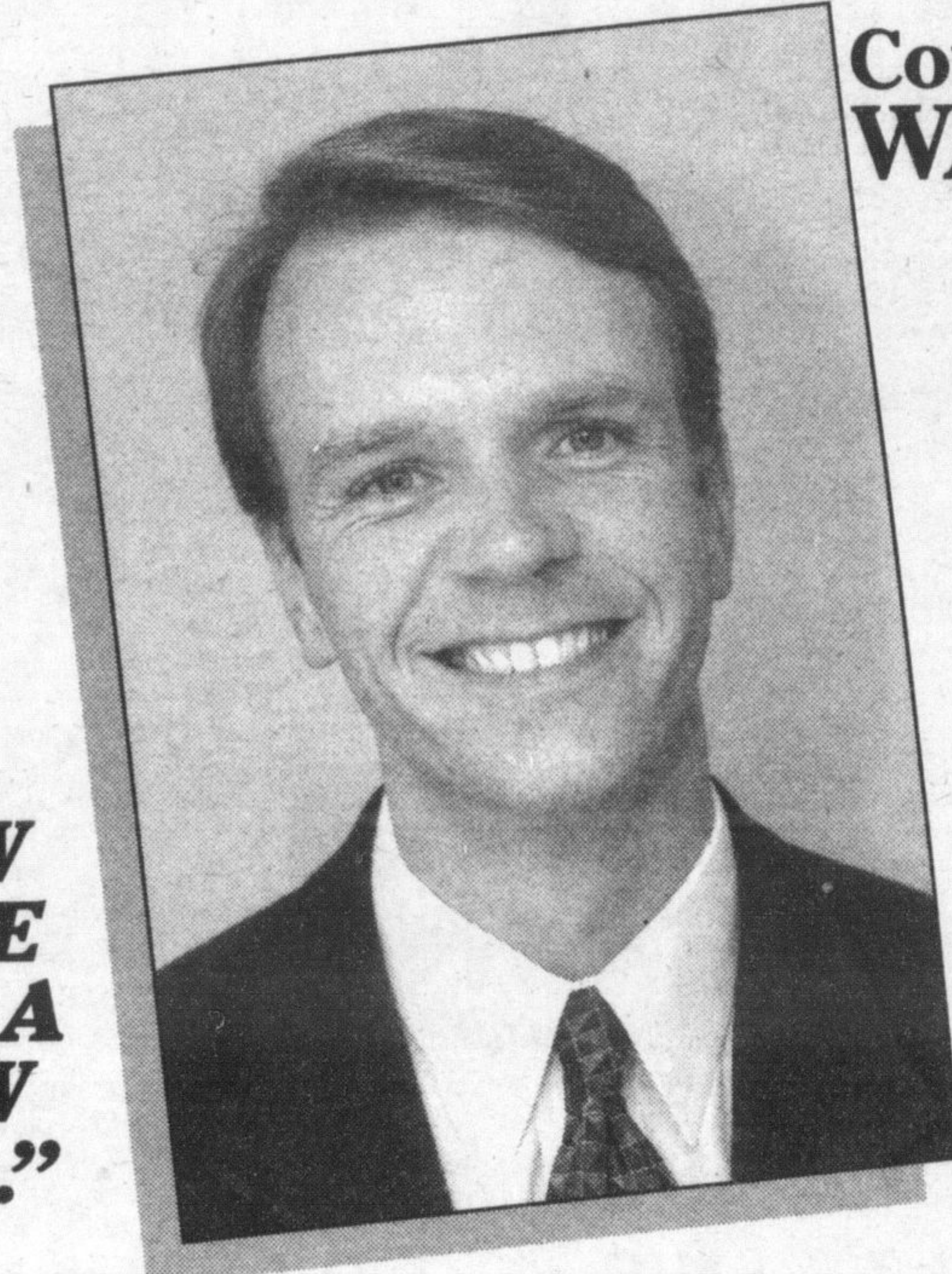

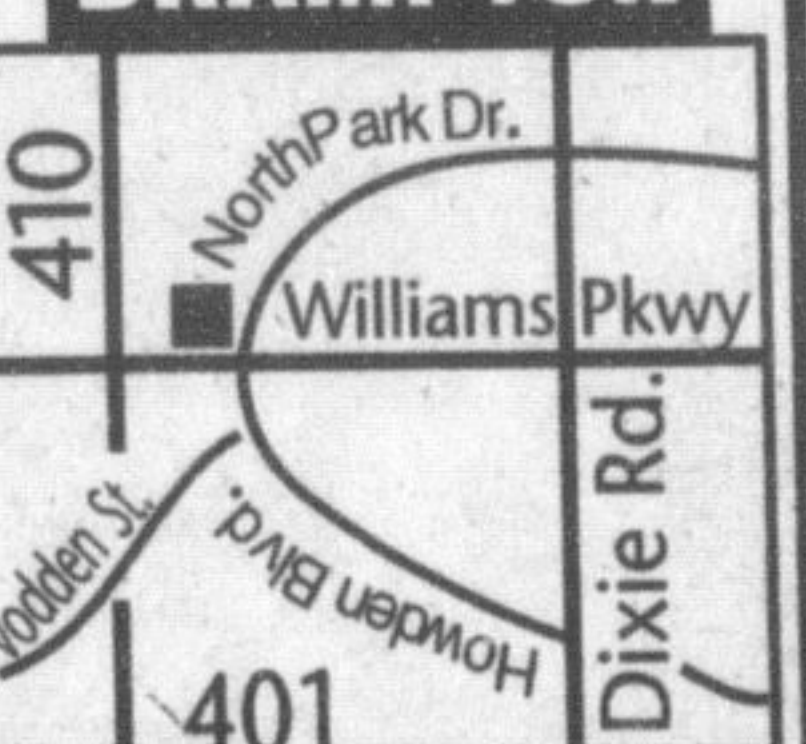
