






Survey on rural garbage collection starts Monday

Halton Region and the Town will conduct a survey to determine if rural residents want to receive roadside garbage collection.

Residents will receive the surveys via mail starting Monday.

Residents are encouraged to respond to the postage-paid survey, as the results will be used by Milton council to determine if once-a-week garbage collection will be provided to all rural households.

Rural residents would pay for the service based on their property value assessment and at the same tax rate that urban residents

The Region and the Town will hold two public open houses to give residents an

opportunity to speak to staff and learn more about the initiative.

The meetings will take place November 18 at the Boyne Community Centre and November 19 at the Nassagaweya Community Centre. Both will be held from 4:30 to 9 p.m.

The results of the survey will be presented to town council next month.

The Region operates the service, but town council must first approve it.
