

They are the faces of the young and brave Who died in a conflict, to freedom save Faces so young, that will never grow old Bodies once warm, now in death are cold


From town and farm, from all walks of life Volunteering, when the bugle sounded strife Into the battle's forefront, they went to fight Valiantly they struggled, for what was right
