Hart Jr. enjoys impressive tune-up for the provincials

If Matt Hart Jr. wasn't a legitimate Ontario championship contender before last weekend, he certainly is now.

In his final tune-up to the provincial showcase in Sarnia, Milton's up-and-coming junior dleweight knocked off last year's silver medalist and held his own against the defending national champ at the inaugural Arnie Bhoeam Boxing Classic in St. Catharines.


This collective performance and the bronze medal that went with it — has only served to bolster the local pugilist's high confidence

level heading into his biggest challenge to date.

"It's definitely what I needed (going into provincials)," said the 26-year-old.

Hart Jr. began the weekend tournament against 2002 Ontario silver medalist Andre Azcurra, whom he'd scored a split decision over just two weeks earlier.

This time around the margin of victory was much wider, as the Milton fighter dominated from start to finish and booked passage to round two with a unanimous decision.



Said Hart Jr., "I wanted to put any doubts about our first fight to rest. I had a much easier time beating him compared to two weeks


While falling short the next day, a strong showing and narrow loss to defending national champ Jonathan Bouchner was hardly cause for disappointment.

Hart Jr. fortified his efforts as the split decision bout wore on and in the process, made a number of amateur boxing experts sit up and take notice. The Bouchner-Hart Jr. clash was deemed the most exciting of the tournament, and raised the local fighter's status for this month's provincials.

"I think if it had been a four-round fight I could have pulled it out," suggested Hart Jr. "Overall I think I had a great two-day performance and can't wait for the provincials. Everything is coming together these

The Ontario championships will be held November 20 to 23 in Windsor. A top finish there will put the local boxer in line for a spot on the national team.


