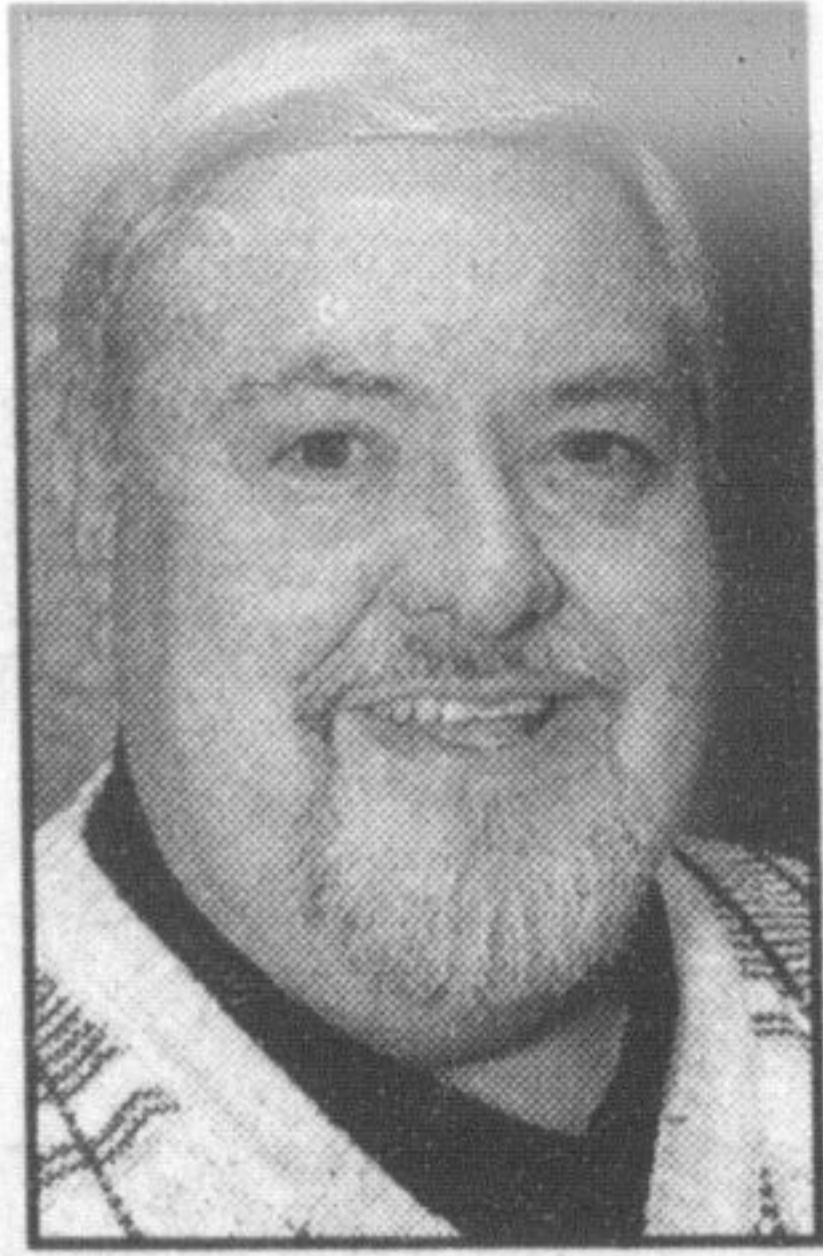


Penman, Day told to stay

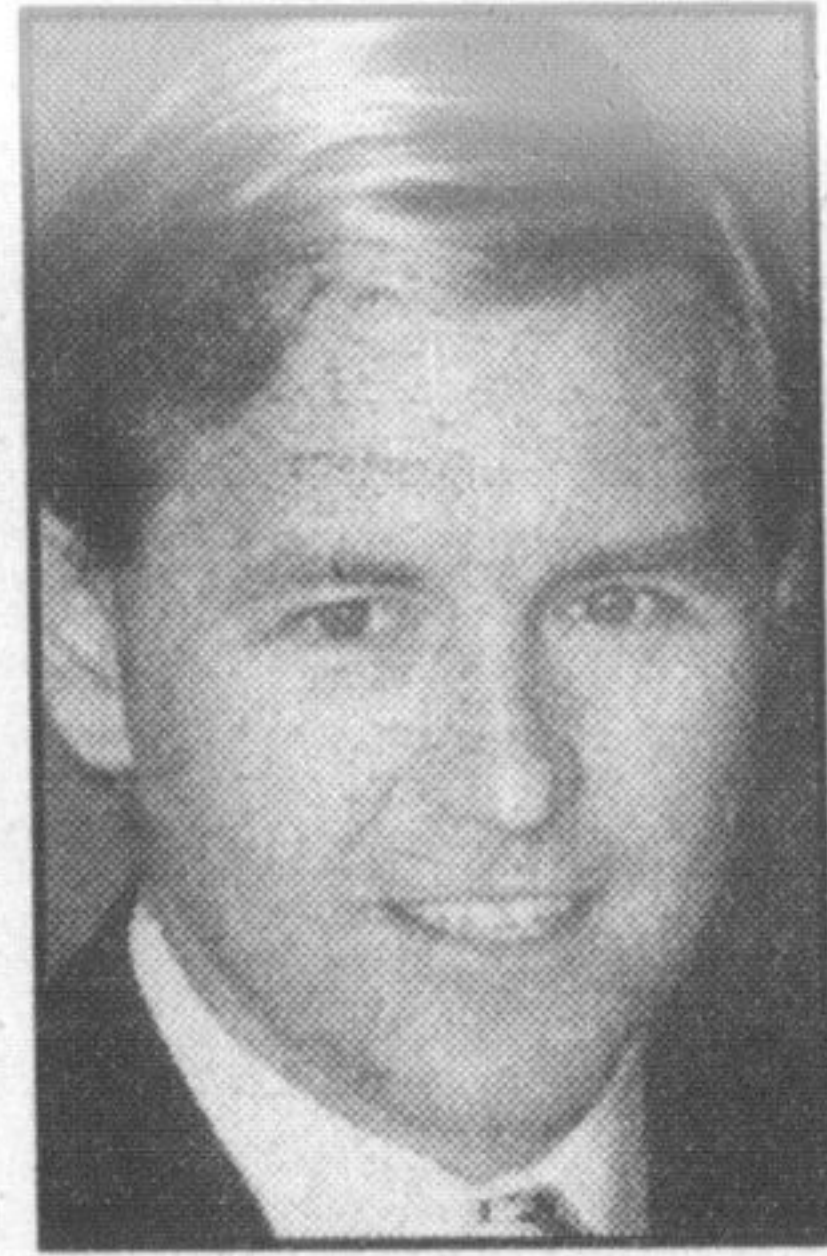
Incumbent councillors Rick Day and Brian Penman were re-elected to Ward 1 last night, bringing with them a combined political track record of 60 years.

Mr. Day, who secured the most votes with 641 and Mr. Penman, in second with 559 votes, both said the election proved to be a tough battle against five competent candidates.

They also agreed growth will define their next three-year term in Ward 1 — the fastest growing in town, already at 15,000.

Mr. Day said a development proposal in the shadow of the Niagara Escarpment, northwest of Main and Bronte streets, is one example of the growth issues he wants to tackle.

"These are the issues that came

up and are the things that made me run," he said.

"We've got tough decisions to make," said Mr. Penman, who, like Mr. Day, gathered at Hugh Foster Hall to celebrate victory. Both were acclaimed in the 2000 election.

Father Mark Curtis got his first political blunder out of the way early.

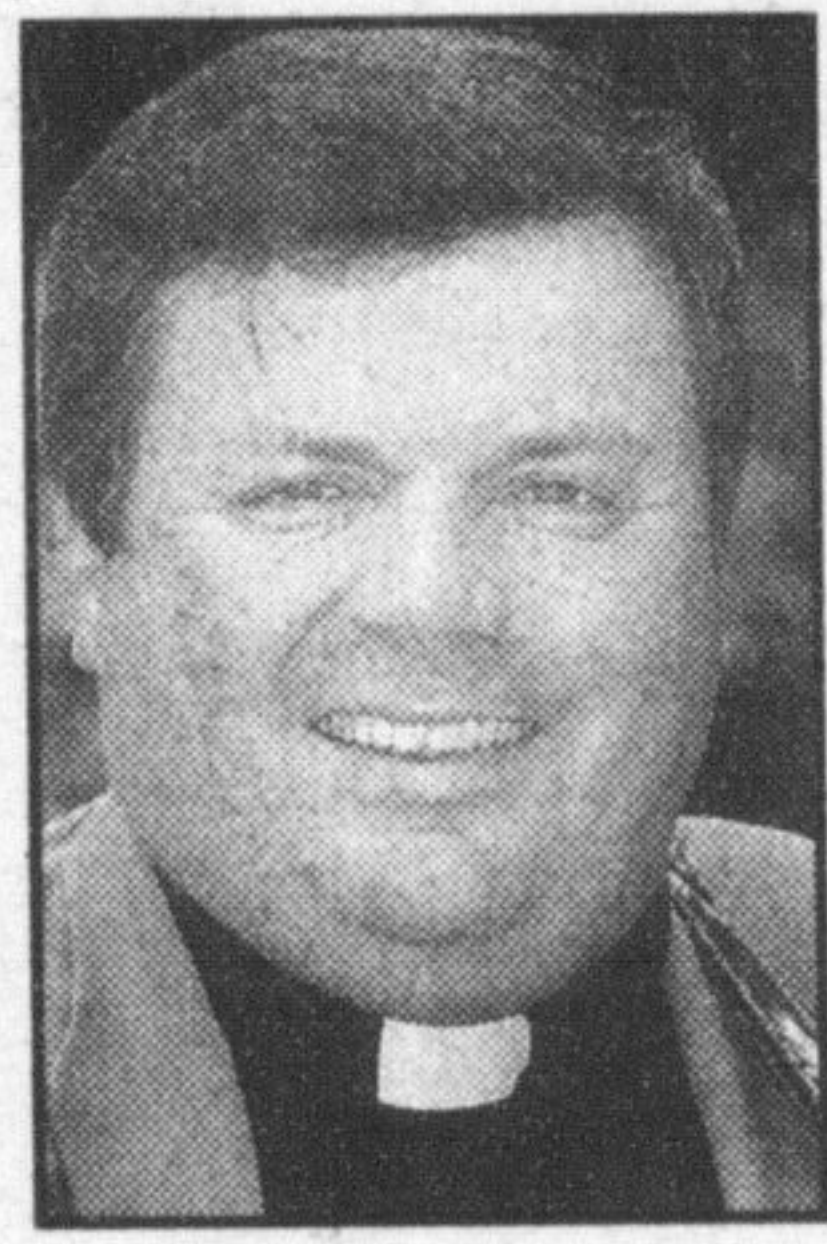
In a too-close-for-comfort battle for Ward 2's second council post, the well-known priest mistakingly conceded defeat to Colin Best around 9 p.m.
