
Penman, Day told to stay

Incumbent councillors Rick Day and Brian Penman were re-elected to Ward 1 last night, bringing with them a combined political track record of 60 years.


Mr. Day, who secured the most votes with 641 and Mr. Penman, in second with 559 votes,

In a too-close-forcomfort battle for Ward 2's second council post, the well-known priest mistakingly conceded defeat to Colin Best around 9 p.m.


It wasn't long before the razor-thin
