
Every light on the Tree of Caring will represent the community's support of the hospital. Once again, the foundation is holding its Buy a Bulb program, which allows people to purchase lights for the tree. Funds raised will go toward a video gastroscope.

As part of the 'We Believe in Angels' campaign, each donor giving more than \$50 toward the tree lighting program will receive a wooden, glass or pewter angel Christmas tree ornament.

Donors giving \$200 or more will receive a Seagull pewter Angel of Dreams ornament — the first in a series of three limited-edition ornaments etched with the logo of the Milton District Hospital Foundation.

The donation can be made in honour of someone or in memory of a loved one. A separate Tree of Memories will be lit with white lights to honour those who have passed away.
