

# Man commits lewd act in plaza at Ontario St. and Derry Rd.

Police are asking for the public's help after a woman at a local restaurant reported seeing a man commit an indecent act in front of her last week.

Police said the woman was eating in a window booth at the Pizza Hut restaurant at 550 Ontario St. December 2. Sometime between 6 and 7:45 p.m., a black, four-door sports car pulled up in front of the window and the driver opened the vehicle door and began masturbating, police said.

He then got out of the car, stood beside it and continued his actions before driving away.

Police are looking for a white man between the ages of 30 and 35, with a beard. He was wearing a gray hat.

### Man spots trespassers

Police are looking for three men after a trespassing incident was reported last week at the 420 Main St. E plaza.

At about 7:30 p.m. December 4, a plaza employee heard noises coming from the roof and spotted a man on the staircase leading to the roof. Two more men were near the second-floor front entrance. Nothing was stolen.

## Police Blotter

Police are looking for three males. One is described as non-white, five-foot-eight, about 25 years old with a goatee, stocky build, dark hair and a red bomber jacket with a 'B' on the back.

The other two men are white, between five-foot-eight and five-foot-10, with slim builds.

### Gas station broken into

The Petro Canada gas station at the corner of Bronte and Main streets was broken into early Sunday morning.

Just after 2 a.m., unknown suspects threw a rock through the glass front door, setting off the alarm. They then pried open a cupboard and stole \$2,400 worth of cigarettes.

### Car stolen from lot

A car was stolen from a Millside Drive apartment parking lot last Friday afternoon.

Unknown suspects stole the 1991 blue Chrysler Dynasty from 101 Millside Dr. at about 2 p.m.

The estimated value of the stolen car is \$5,000.

### Car window smashed

The window of a vehicle parked in a Woodland Crescent driveway was smashed last week.

Unknown suspects smashed the rear window overnight December 4, causing \$500 in damage.

### Window damaged

A window of a Strathcona Court home was damaged by a pellet gun sometime between November 27 and December 2.

Unknown suspects caused \$150 worth of damage to the bathroom window.

### Tire slashed

A tire of a vehicle parked in the Milton District High School parking lot was slashed last week.

Sometime between 8:25 a.m. and 1:30 p.m., unknown suspects punctured the passenger side rear tire of the car, causing \$150 in damage.

### House broken into

An Eighth Line house was broken into last Friday.

Sometime between 11 a.m. and 10 p.m., the door of the rural home was forced open by unknown suspects.

No property was taken, and there was minimal damage to the door.

# Police release picture of robber in village heist

Halton Regional Police need your help in identifying a suspect who robbed the Scotia Bank in Campbellville in the summer.

On August 28 at 4:55 p.m., the suspect, disguised in a straw hat and dust mask, entered the bank, located at 36 Main St. N.

The suspect removed a black semi-automatic handgun from a white plastic bag he was carrying and demanded cash from tellers.

The tellers complied, putting cash in the plastic bag and the suspect calmly exited the bank.

Coincidentally, the suspect discovered a Lincoln Navigator SUV that had been left unattended and idling outside the bank.

The suspect stole the vehicle and fled north on Main Street.

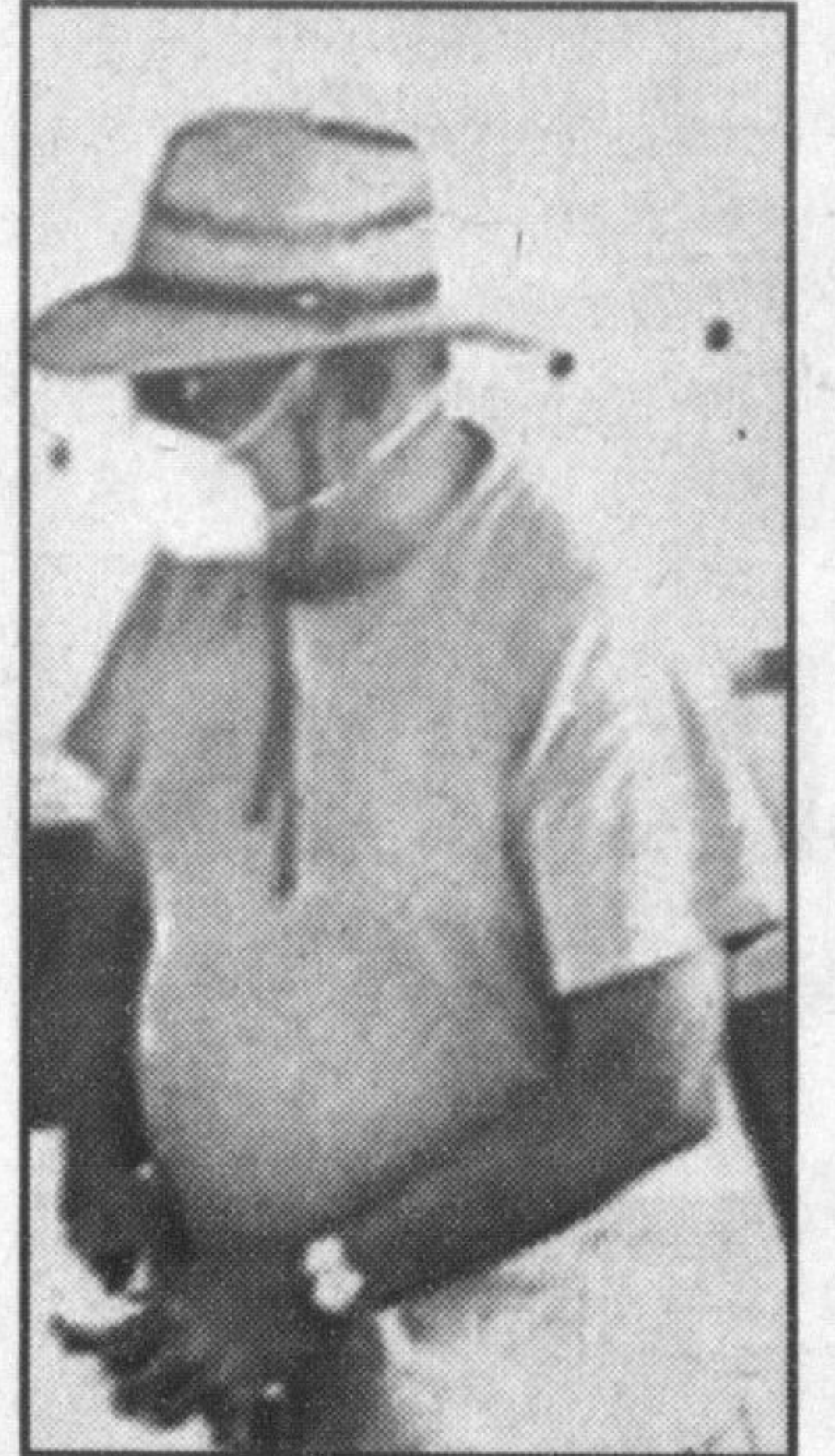
The SUV was discovered a short distance away in a car-pool lot at Guelph Line and Hwy. 401.

The suspect is described as white, between 40 and 60 years old, 6 feet tall, weighing 200 pounds with a pot belly.
