Region extends public consultation process for sewage plant expansion

Halton Region has announced the next round of consultation on the expansion of the mid-Halton sewage treatment plant in Oakville.

The Province requires an evaluation of conceptual designs, implementation concepts for achieving the capacity expansion, a full evaluation of environmental impacts and mitigation measures.

"Major facilities such as our sewage treatment plants require years of planning, followed by the construction of each phase. During this next phase, Halton remains committed to keeping the community informed about the plans for mid-Halton and any changes that are implemented," said Regional Chairman Joyce Savoline.

Recognizing the community's interest in the plant expansion, Halton Region has opted to extend the public consultation beyond the statutory provincial requirements.

Two public meetings will be scheduled in January and March.

Regular communications through project updates, a project web page and a dedicated e-mail address (midhalton@region.halton.on.ca) and phone number (905-825-6000, ext. 7354) will be used as communication vehicles throughout the process.

The public will also receive a response to their written comments. Information on the public meetings will be communicated through newspaper advertising, the Region's web site and the Mid-Halton phone line.

The 31-year-old plant, located on North Service Road, will service future expansion in Oakville, Milton and areas along the Halton Hills Hwy. 401 corridor.




