2003 has been a year of growth for Arts Milton. Not only is our membership up significantly, but we have moved forward with several new initiatives to enhance our membership benefits.

In late 2002, your board of directors streamlined our committee work by setting up three distinct subcommittees; Advocacy, Communications and Education (ACE). Within this new framework, we have been able to concentrate our activities on those areas where we felt our members could receive a high return for their investment in Arts Milton.

Each of these subcommittees is chaired by a board member who is dedicated to the goals of the arts community in Milton and is supported not only by the board, but also by interested and equally dedicated members of the Milton and area community at large. This is important to our future growth. It means that we are not acting simply as a small board, but that we are engaging our growing community in our efforts to increase the visibility of the artistic talent in our town.

Our Communications subcommittee under the leadership of Harvey Shoemaker, has continued to improve the quality of the Arts Milton website (www.artsmilton.ca). They are responsible for this newsletter as well as news and articles in the local newspapers. They have done an excellent job this year with timely articles as well as postings of event calendars.

Our Education subcommittee, in the capable hands of Hazel Carlin, has developed and presented a seminar for our members on working effectively with the media. They are also working on a seminar to be presented in early 2004 on "Effective Grant Applications"; an important topic for most of our membership.

The Advocacy subcommittee is chaired by your president, but involves all of the board members. Our major concern is the development of an Arts and Entertainment facility in the Town of Milton. We have taken several major steps along what would seem to be a long and arduous path towards this important goal in the last year. As most of our membership is aware, the Town has been developing plans for the construction of an Arts and Entertainment Centre in Milton as part of a program that includes a new Library and expansion of Town Hall. Feasibility studies have progressed to the point that Council has accepted site locations for each of these facilities and has authorized the development of a business plan. Much is left to be

done before a home for the arts community is constructed. Arts Milton is a member of the steering committee and continues to work closely with the

We welcome input from all our readers on this project and urge anyone who has an interest to join Arts Milton and assist us in ensuring that this facility meets our needs and the needs of the community at large. Our strength lies in our membership.

Plans for 2004 include a Festival of the Arts that will be geared to the youth in our community. This is scheduled for May and more information will be included in future editions of this News letter. Look for more information on upcoming seminars and other functions.

If you are not already a member of Arts Milton, but have seen some of the excellent work that this organization is doing in the community, please consider becoming a member. Fees are very low and offer a valuable conduit to the artistic activities in Milton and the surrounding community.


