

Police searching for three suspects after a fight breaks out

Police are looking for three suspects after a fight broke out in front of an Ontario Street apartment building last Friday.

At about 11 p.m., a resident of the apartment asked two males and a female to leave the property.

Police said the three suspects surrounded the man and knocked his cell phone out of his hands when he tried to phone for help.

Two more apartment residents approached the group, attempting to assist the man, and a fight broke out.

There were no injuries.

By the time police arrived, the three suspects had fled.

The first suspect is described as a white male, 5-foot-10 with facial hair, wearing blue pants and a dark jacket.

The second suspect is a white male, shorter than the other suspect, wearing a dark jacket and a black winter hat with a white stripe.

The third suspect is a white female about 17 years old, five-foot-eight to five-foot-nine.

She was wearing a beige jacket and a white hat.

Police lay assault charge

Police charged a Milton man with assault Sunday evening.

At about 10:30 p.m., a resident of a low-rise apartment on Regional Road 25 allegedly went to the upstairs apartment armed with a four-foot metal pipe and tried to force his way in.

He was physically restrained by another resident until police arrived.

A 36-year-old man of Regional Road 25 was charged with assault with a weapon, uttering death threats and break and enter with intent.

Senior ripped off

Police are looking for a man who stole money from a senior citizen's apartment.

At about 3 p.m., the man showed up at an Ontario Street apartment building and buzzed a random resident, who let him in, police said.

The man knocked on an apartment door

and told the resident he was there to check the curtains in the residence.

After being let in, he entered the resident's bedroom and took a small quantity of cash and a portable phone battery, police said.

The suspect is a white male, about five-foot-10, 175 to 200 pounds with dark hair. He was clean shaven and was wearing a black t-shirt and black pants.

Police are investigating.

Police are searching for a suspect after an 11-year-old boy's backpack was stolen December 19.

According to police, the boy was walking home from school at about 1:45 p.m. in the area of Woodward Avenue and Lorne Scots Drive.

When he bent down to tie his shoelaces, his green and white Point Zero backpack was grabbed.

The suspect is described as white with an average build, between 168 and 178 cm tall.

He was wearing black pants and a black sweatshirt.
