## Cash from Mohawk slots just keeps on coming in

Milton has received \$1.7 million for hosting slots at Mohawk Racetrack.

The payment, from Ontario Lottery and Gaming Corporation racetracks and charity casinos. (OLGC), was for Milton's thirdquarter share of the slots revenue (October to December 2003).

To date, Milton has received more than \$27 million in non-tax gaming revenue. Payments are made on a quarterly basis according to the government's fiscal year, which runs April to the end of March.

Slots at Mohawk opened on August 10, 1999. Since then, it has attracted more than 6.2 million visitors, averaging approximately 3,900 patrons daily.

In total, OLGC has issued more than \$17 million in third-quarter non-tax gaming revenue payments to 21 host communities of slots at

Each slots-at-racetrack host municipality receives 5 per cent of the facility's gross slot machine revenue for the first 450 machines and 2 per cent for any machines above that number. Funds are used at the discretion of the municipali-

Race tracks and their horse people also share the revenue generated by the slots program, with 20 per cent of gross slot machine revenue split evenly between the two groups.

Since the launch of the program

in 1998, more than \$1 billion has been shared equally between racetrack owners and their horse peo-

Revenue from OLGC supports \$100 million annually for the province's charities.

The money is distributed to charities through the Ontario Trillium Foundation.

A portion of the annual gross slot revenue from slot facilities at racetracks and charity casinos goes to the Ministry of Health and Longterm Care for problem gambling research, treatment, prevention and public awareness.

Slots at Mohawk Racetrack are operated and managed by the OLGC.
