

# Juveniles even with Windsor

The Milton juveniles' powerplay proved to be both a blessing and a curse last weekend in OMHA semifinal play against the AAA Windsor Spitfires.

In the best-of-five series opener at Milton Sports Centre Saturday afternoon, a first-period mauling of Kyle Burrell allowed teammate Julian Ricci to score with the man-advantage.

Sparked by the early lead, the Winterhawks would strike three more times and enjoy a flawless performance from Jon Sweetland en route to whitewashing Windsor.

Milton's other marksmen were Barry Kosmalski, Matt Stockton and captain Rick Nadalin — who also picked up an assist. Scott McLaughlin helped set up the last two goals and was among the focal points of a particularly rough final frame.

The Winterhawks wouldn't escape the series opener completely unscathed, however, as their high penalty count earned head coach Jim Kosmalski a one-game suspension.

Whether or not that factored into things the following afternoon in Windsor, Milton's juveniles just didn't seem to be on the same page at crucial points of game two.

Individualistic play led to two shorthanded goals against and an eventual 3-1 defeat.
