





Top triathlete

OMHA playoffs and not really in position to contend for Tri County gold.

"It was a parental decision," confirmed the elder Pepper, who's sent a letter of complaint regarding the matter to the OMHA. "I think they (MMHA) took it a little too far. They're trying to make an example of Chris."

Agreed Greg, "I can't believe how much fuss has been made over this. I think they overreacted."

When it looked as though Brennan's suspension might be reduced, controversy struck again.

During a Valentine's Day fundraising dance at Memorial Arena's Lions Club Hall February 14, Monk and a number of other OMHA executives spotted Brennan coaching a Hurricanes practice.

Knowing he was to cease all involvement with the team, Brennan stressed that he had no intention of being at the practice that night.

However, just an hour before it was set to start, the suspended coach got a call from his assistant Ron Woodworth, whose car had broken down on the way in from Kitchener.

So instead of canceling the practice — which he said "wasn't in the best interest of the players" — Brennan went ahead and supervised it.

Another call to the OMHA about the latter violation cemented Brennan's suspension for the remainder of

2003/04 play.

"They've (MMHA) got their noses out of joint over this and seem to be out for revenge," fumed Brennan, who was suspended for inadvertently using illegal players last season as well. "Yes I broke protocol, but they (MMHA) could have gone through proper channels and come to the Hurricanes first."

Monk questioned why, if his organization was out to get the Hurricane midgets, it would allow fellow midget Nick Cardin to go there earlier in the year.

He added, "It's not for me to communicate with the Hurricanes, it's for them to come to us when they want a player."

"You can plead ignorance all you want, but the rules are the rules and it's pretty hard to dispute that they were broken."

Brennan maintains his belief that Milton Minor Hockey has a personal beef against him, stemming — in part — from the fact that he was originally supposed to coach the AA midgets this year before accepting the Hurricanes post.

"Bottom line is they're (MMHA) just trying to show their muscle and it's our kids that are suffering because of it," he said.

Meanwhile, Pepper now finds himself back with the AA midgets, who have three games remaining in Tri County round-robin play, but are essentially out of championship contention.

Spartans play OFSAA qualifier today

The E.C. Drury Spartans girls hockey team will attempt to qualify for Ontario Federation of School Athletic Associations playoffs today (Tuesday) when it hosts Oakville's Queen Elizabeth Park.

The Spartans and Eagles are scheduled to face off at Thompson Arena, beginning at 3:30 p.m., with the winner moving on to compete at the OFSAA 'A/AA' tournament later this month.

Drury posted a 5-2-2 record in regular season play, finishing fifth in the Richardson Division. The Spartans knocked off the Aldershot Aces 3-2 in the opening round of the playoffs before falling 5-0 to the Notre

Dame Fighting Irish.

Q.E. Park struggled to a 3-4-2 mark and finished sixth in the Volpe Division, but managed to upset the Holy Trinity Titans 2-1 in preliminary round playoff action. The Eagles were bounced from Halton playoffs, however, with a 4-3 loss to the T.A. Blakelock Tigers.

The OFSAA 'A/AA' championships will be held March 29-31 in Pembroke.

The Halton final is also scheduled to be played today, with the Assumption Crusaders taking on Notre Dame. Game time at Burlington's Mainway Arena is 3:30 p.m.
