Purpose: As part of the five-year review of its Official Plan, Halton Regional Council adopted a set of 76 directions in June 2003 as the basis for making changes to the Plan, including:

- · A firm urban boundary to accommodate growth to year 2021.
- Enhanced policies to increase the supply of affordable housing.
- Programs to support the long-term viability of Halton's agricultural industry.
- An updated and expanded greenlands system.
- · Commitments to improving air and water quality.
