Struggle ensues after man refuses to open car window

A number of charges were laid after a man sitting in a running vehicle refused to open his window to a police officer last week.

On March 25 at 9:40 p.m., a police officer approached a stationary car at the side of Walker Line, north of Derry Road.

The driver locked himself in the car and refused to provide identification or roll down the window, police said.

Eventually, the window was smashed by police and a struggle followed. There were no injuries.

A 45-year-old Burlington man was charged with impaired care and control of a vehicle, having open liquor in the vehicle, resisting arrest, obstructing police and possession of drugs.

Ten cars broken into

A rash of vehicles from two Bronte Street townhouse complexes were broken into overnight March 23, causing police to remind residents to lock their vehicles.

In the parking lot of 371 Bronte Street, seven unlocked vehicles were entered by unknown suspects. Money, a CD player, and a cordless power drill were among the items stolen.

At 235 Bronte St., three vehicles

were broken into. Stolen items include mail, a cell phone, and a duffel bag containing sports equipment and cash. Once again, all the vehicles were unlocked.

Halton Regional Police Det. Sgt. Don Cousens emphasized that crimes of opportunity can be prevented.

"Keep your car doors locked. We have situations where people break windows to get inside, but in this situation an individual was wandering to the easiest score—unlocked vehicles."

Smokes stolen in break-ins

Cigarettes were stolen during two break-ins that happened March 25.

The first incident happened at 3:15 a.m., when unknown suspects broke into Kitchen Food Fair Convenience on Ontario Street by smashing open the front door. Fifty cartons of cigarettes, valued at \$3,000, were taken.

Just before 4 a.m., Morningside Esso on Regional Road 25 was broken into. Once again, the unknown suspects smashed the

front door to get inside. An unknown quantity of cigarettes was taken.

Damage to the doors in both incidents is pegged at \$400 each.

Drunk driving charge laid

Police laid drunk driving charges March 24 after a motorist was pulled over by a police officer conducting spot checks.

The motorist was pulled over at about 10:30 p.m. at Guelph Line and No. 20 Sideroad.

A 59-year-old Mattawa, Ont. man was charged with impaired driving and having over the legal amount of alcohol in his blood.

Two vehicles broken into

Two vehicles parked at the GO Transit lot on Main Street were broken into last Friday.

Unknown suspects smashed the rear passenger window of a 2004 Toyota and stole a CD player and CDs. The value of the stolen property was \$500.

Also, a Kenwood CD player, stereo equipment and golf clubs were stolen from a 1998 Honda Civic.

The total value of the stolen property was \$3,200.

Pre-trial set in child porn case

A pre-trial date has been set for a Milton man charged with possession and distribution of child pornography in January.

Kirk Scott Pierrepoint, 34, will appear May 14 at Ontario Court of Justice in Oakville.

The date was set Tuesday morning at Ontario Court

of Justice in Burlington.

Mr. Pierrepoint will also appear April 14 at the Burlington courthouse to be spoken to before the pretrial, requested by his lawyer, Mark Miller.

Mr. Pierrepoint, of Oriole Court, has also been charged with possession of a controlled substance.
