Sometime overnight April 16, suspects entered a fenced compound at the rear of Coreline Auto Parts, located at 842 Nipissing Rd. Culprits used bolt cutters to snap the lock to a storage cage inside the compound and stole two oxygen tanks, two propane tanks and two acetelyne tanks. All six tanks were empty.

The total loss is \$1,900.


