## Mays feel sting of Oakville Buzz

Another slow start, another tough loss for the rebuilding Mavericks.

Stuck in neutral until well into the second period — fast becoming a trend this spring — Milton was once again stung by former coach Glenn Little and the Oakville Buzz Tuesday night at John Tonelli Sports Centre.

The 15-8 defeat came in front of a rather spase crowd, which seemed more interested in the Maple Leafs' fate than that of the hometown juniors.

Scoring just one first-period goal for the fourth time in five games, the Mavericks worked themselves into a hefty hole and just couldn't make up the difference.

But as offensively frigid as the hosts were early on, flawed goaltending and defense — which at times was non-existent — were equally concerning.

In fact about the only real bright spot on the night was a 5-for-8 powerplay campaign. At even strength the Mavericks couldn't work the outlet pass to any kind of effectiveness and were either unable or unwilling to brave high-traffic areas to create opportunities.

By contrast, the steadily-improving Buzz exhibited a fair amount of offensive depth — with eight different players denting the twine and half-a-dozen recording multi-point games.

For Milton, Troy Hazzard pushed his goal scoring streak to four games with a third-period deposit, while Matt Bolton, Jon Ram and Jon Sweetland all tallied twice.

Adam Rutz struggled to win key draws, but struck with the manadvantage and provided the biggest physical presence up front—at least through the late stages of play.

Acting captain Kyle Goertz — wearing the 'C' while Rick Gallinger continues to nurse a broken thumb — was limited to two assists. Adam Elias and Chris Ingraham split the cage work.

Now 1-4, Milton continues a three-game home stand tonight against head coach Trevor Reid's former team, the Scarborough Saints. Game time is 8:30 p.m.
