"The quality and accessibility of our health care has far-reaching impacts in Halton, including our ability to attract industry and business, and to provide a healthy, sustainable community."



who practice in this community and who are committed to ensuring Halton residents receive quality health care," said Angela Sugden Praysner, Halton's physician recruitment coordinator.


"We need to let our doctors know how much they are respected and valued, so they can help pass on the word that this is a world class community in which to practice medicine and live."
