Harrop Restaurant Charity Tables

A message from Robert Goderre and Staff at the Harrop Restaurant:

Effective January 19th, 2004 we started to charge \$20.00/table to anyone seated at either of our 2 designated Charity Tables only. Both tables seat up to 5 persons and are in front of a fireplace. You choose which of the 3 local charities (The United Way of Milton, The Milton Hospital Foundation and Halton Women's Place) you would like that \$20.00 donation to go to. The \$20.00 needs to be paid up front (cash or debit card) and a form filled out with name/address for tax receipt purposes (and of course you may choose to donate more than the \$20.00). It is our goal to raise in excess of \$30,000.00 per year from this idea/concept alone and a further \$20,000.00 in several other fund raising events we host annually. Please consider partnering with us in making a difference in the lives of those in need.

Distress Centres

There is nothing more precious than the voice of a friend when you're in the midst of a crisis.

Sometimes, just to make it through the day, a good listener or someone to help you work your way through a problem makes all the difference in the world. The Distress Centres do just that - supports people in Milton, Oakville and surrounding areas, people who deal with some form of distress by providing a confidential, caring, compassionate, free telephone service for people of all ages. The 70 volunteers at the Distress Centres go through an intensive selection and orientation process, and a sevenweek training course prior to volunteering for four-hour shifts answering distress calls.

Occasionally, the only consistent human contact some callers have are the volunteers at the Distress Centre, and callers depend on their volunteers for help with problem solving, decision-making, life perspectives and other skills they don't have or don't use regularly.

Some callers only contact the Distress Centre once, and many call back repeatedly as they attempt to deal with their problems. One thing all callers have in common is their need to talk things over with someone who is a good listener and who can help them work their way through their problems.

The Distress Centres' lines are open seven days a week from noon to midnight, and can be contacted at 905-849-4541 in Oakville, or 905-877-1211 in North Halton.

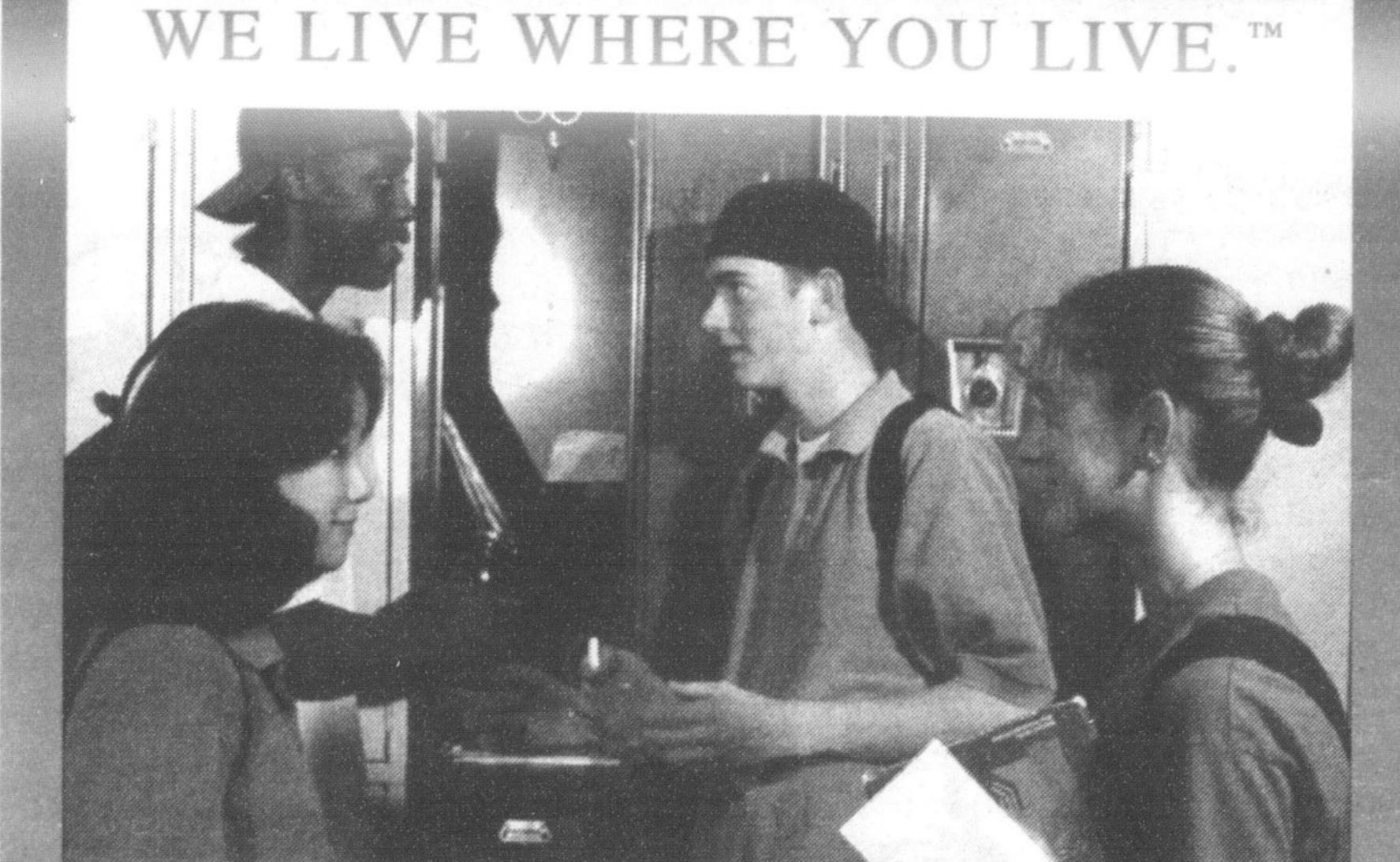

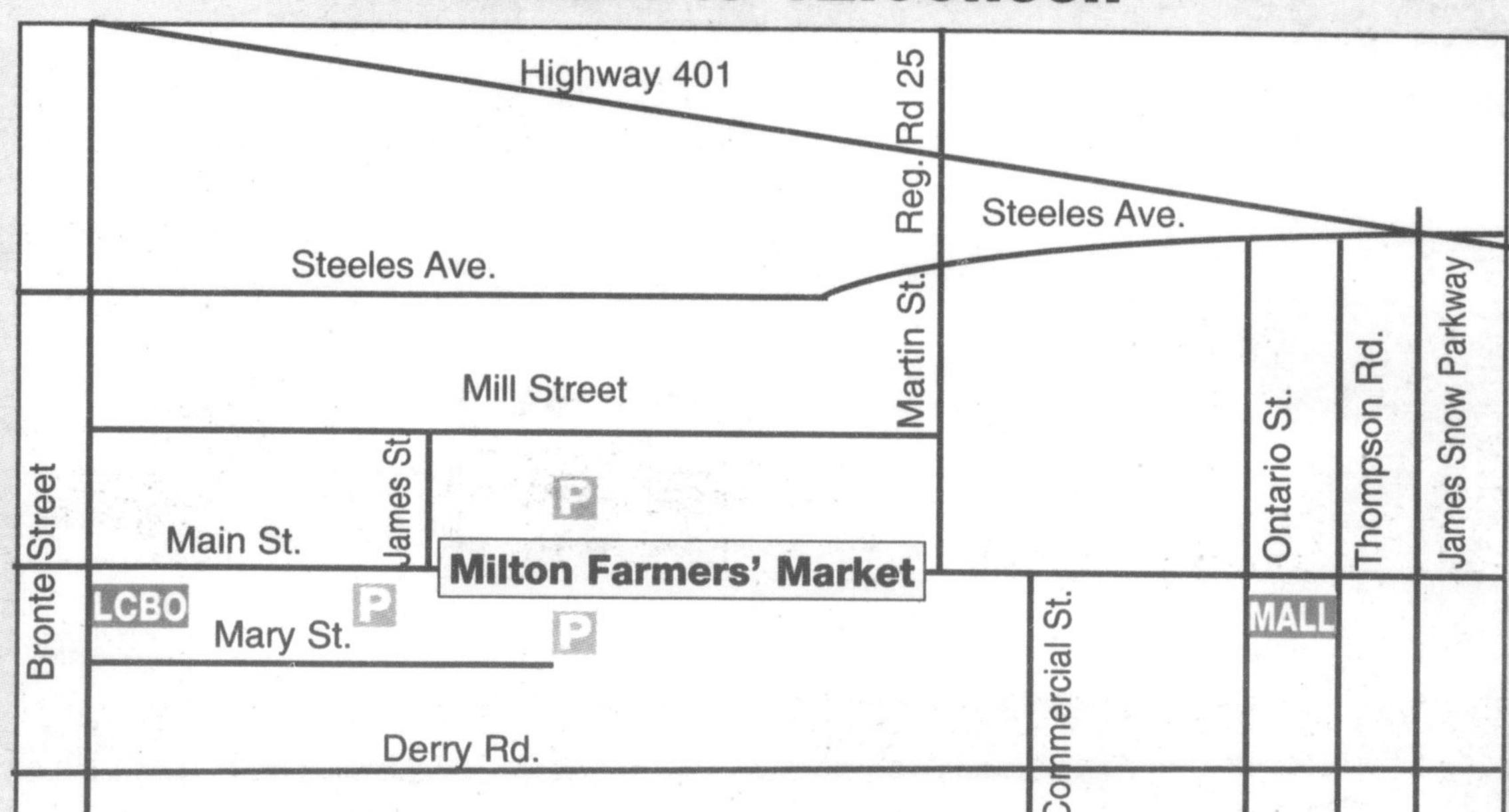
