

Rural man recognized for work on area citizen/police committee

Bert Walton of Campbellville is this year's recipient of the Lyn Benson Memorial Award.

Presented Wednesday at the Halton Regional Centre by Halton Regional Poice Chief Ean Algar, the award recognizes volunteer work involving police services within the community.

Any person who volunteers with the Halton Regional Police Service is eligible to receive the award.

Mr. Walton is a member of the Nassagaweya Community Consultation Committee (N.C.C.C.), a citizen-based group that serves as a median between the average person and police as well as other matters pertaining to the community.

He's the fourth Nassagaweya resident to receive the award in recent years. Other award recipients include Mike West, Jean Wood and Jan Mowbray, all fellow members of the N.C.C.C.

"I received a registered letter from the police about three weeks ago and immediately wondered what I had done," laughed Mr. Walton. "I was quite surprised to realize that I had won the award. I never expected it at all."

Organizers of the Conservation Halton Foundation's upcoming Summer Solstice Auction say there will be something for everyone.

The third annual charity auction will be held June 18 at 7 p.m. at the Halton Region Museum, at Kelso Conservation Area.

The event includes both silent and live auctions.

Proceeds from the Summer Solstice Auction will go toward the expansion and renovation of the Visitors Centre at Mountsberg Conservation Area in Campbellville. It's renowned for its maple syrup, birds of prey and wide open spaces.

"Over 50,000 people come to Mountsberg every year and use the centre as a launch point for learning about nature in our watershed and enjoying our beautiful park," said John Riddell, Mountsberg manager.

He said the expanded centre will help provide a higher quality experience for visitors and will mean more people can participate in the programs.

The foundation is a volunteer charitable organization that raises funds for Conservation Halton, the environmental agency that conserves natural areas in its watershed.
