# Former Halton teacher faces child porn charges

Suspect taught at E.C. Dury High School in 1980s; police asking any victims to come forward

A Toronto man charged with possession of child pornography worked for nearly 30 years as a teacher in Halton.

Leslie Hoogland, 53, was arrested last Friday after police seized hundreds of photographs during a raid of a Toronto home.

During a news conference at Toronto police headquarters Monday, Det. Sgt. Paul Gillespie of the sex crimes unit said although the majority of the photographs were of transient young men, the investigation shows students were among those photographed.

"We would invite anybody who may have been photographed by the accused to

A Toronto man charged with please come forward and call our ossession of child pornography office," he said.

Police have asked parents to discuss the arrest with their children and see if there was any sort of inappropriate contact with Mr. Hoogland.

Det. Sgt. Gillespie is asking anyone else who may have been photographed to call Det. Const. Warren Bulmer of the sex crimes unit at (416) 808-8395.

At the time of his arrest, Mr. Hoogland had been teaching at West Toronto Collegiate.

From 1973 to 2001, he was employed by the Halton public school board.

After coming to Canada from the Netherlands in 1973, Mr.

Hoogland taught classes at Gladys Speers Public School in Oakville until 1979.

During a sabbatical in 1977 and 1978 he was at the Dorothy Stringer High School in Brighton, England and from 1979 to 1984 taught at Thomas A. Blakelock High School in Oakville.

Mr. Hoogland spent from 1984 to 1989 at E.C. Drury High School in Milton, from 1989 to 1995 at the Syl Apps School in Oakville and from 1995 until his retirement from the Halton District School Board in 2001 at General Brock High School in Burlington.

He taught English, marketing and literacy classes at the Toronto school since October 2003.

Pieces of cardboard, paper, and wood as well as garbage bags are only a few of the items that have been littering the community as residents do their spring cleaning.


This weekend, police will conduct spot checks on vehicles they see transporting loads, to ensure safety measures are being taken.






### Notes
