Police searching for suspect in assault on T.O. man

Police are looking for a suspect after a 20year-old Toronto man was punched last Friday.

The victim was walking westbound on Main Street, near Ontario Street, when he was approached by four white males on black BMX bikes.

The victim was grabbed and punched in the face before the group fled.

Fortunately, he didn't require medical attention, police said.

The man who did the punching is described as white, five-foot-11, between 19 and 23 years old with black hair and a thin muscular build. He was wearing a red sleeveless shirt and grey pants.

Trailer stolen


