Worker suffers facial burns after propane tank explodes

Despite his burns, injured man puts out fire with garden hose

A worker whose face was burnt a small propane container explodfrom becoming even worse with his quick thinking, fire personnel said.

Last Tuesday at about 1:30 p.m., a contractor was renovating the living room of a Trafalgar Road house just south of Britannia Road when

in a fire prevented a bad situation ed, said Milton Fire Department training technician Barry Kory.

"That probably went a long way to getting the fire down," Mr. Kory said. "It could have been a lot worse."

Within minutes fire crews arrived and finished extinguishing the fire, he said.

The man was transported to Milton District Hospital where he was treated for burns.

Although there was extensive smoke damage throughout the home, fire damage was minimal.
