The motorcyclists are members of a pleasure riding group and shouldn't be confused with outlaw bikers like the Hell's Angels.

"The bikers are a good group of guys," said Noreen Glendinning, owner of Trac's. "They are my best customers and do not cause any trouble. The noise from their bikes is inevitable, they are motorcy-

But nearby store owners wonder if there's another place that could be used for parking to alleviate some of the congestion in the area.

Halton Regional Police say the motorcycles are parked on private property and the property owners aren't complaining, therefore the issue doesn't warrant police involvement.

"The motorcyclists are welcome in Campbellville," said one shopkeeper. "We just wish there was a solution for the parking."




