Ours got a standing ovation — not a single other band got that."

Although chaperoning 23 grade 8 students from May 25 to 27 might not sound like many people's idea of a good time, Ms Brooks said the kids behaved as well as they performed.

"There were zero problems in Montreal," she said, adding the students in the extracurricular band are a tightly-knit group.

Simply being invited to the national competition was a victory in itself, explained Jazz Cats director and music teacher Jeannette Wilson, who's now in her 16th year teaching at W.I. Dick Middle School.

The students first competed in February in St. Catharines for the regional MusicFest competition, where they received a gold standing plus an invitation to the nationals.

The group decided they couldn't pass up the opportunity and doggedly went about fundraising for the trip.

To say Ms Wilson was proud of the students' accomplishment in Montreal is an understatement.

"I almost didn't have to be there, they worked so hard as a team," she said.

Ms Wilson said she has high expectations for all her music students, and once again they didn't disappoint her.

"I think they're capable of a lot at this

"Everyone has a lot of respect for her,"




the 13 year old said, adding, "She brings out the best in her students."


