## Police assaulted at party

Two Milton men face charges of assaulting police in connection with a party at a Laurier Avenue home early Saturday morning.

Shortly after 2 a.m., patrolling officers came upon a man with a beer bottle in his hand standing on Laurier Avenue, and subsequently discovered a loud party.

The confrontation quickly escalated, with a number of party-goers throwing beer bottles at the officers —

including two who attempted to disarm an officer of his Taser gun.

Police wound up using the Taser in the scuffle.

Neither officer was injured in the incident.

Two men, both 20, are each charged with assaulting police, attempting to disarm police and obstructing police. They're scheduled to appear in Burlington court July 21.

## No one hurt in garbage fire

Mohawk Racetrack and Slots was evacuated late Saturday afternoon after a garbage compactor inside the facility caught fire.

The Milton Fire Department attended the Guelph Line facility after receiving a call just before 5 p.m. Fire crews arrived to discover a fire had started in a garbage compactor and smoke had built up in many rooms, said Barry Kory, training technician with the Milton Fire Department.

Patrons inside the premises were evacuated for precautionary meas-

"The fire was knocked down by 5:30 p.m. and fire crews searched for any possible fire extension, as well as beginning ventilation of the smoke," Mr. Kory said.

Fire crews remained at the scene until after 7 p.m. to clear the smoke. No one was hurt.

The cause of the fire in the compactor remains undetermined at this time.
