
Canada Day

REMINDER Polycoat Recycling

Polycoat packaging (including juice boxes, Tetra Pak and gable top containers, like milk and juice cartons) are accepted in your Blue Box.

Juice boxes are made from paper, plastic (polyethylene) and aluminum. When you recycle your juice box, the paper is repulped at a paper mill and made into tissue, toilet paper, boxboard and drywall. The plastic and aluminum is combined into a pellet to make things like plastic flower pots, pails, and lumber.



So this summer when the kids are home, make a little magic and turn empty juice boxes into toilet paper and flower pots all through the power of your Blue Box.
