But Mr. Crocker voiced his skepticism of Mr. Harris' concern, and questioned him about the length of time it took him to walk to the damaging activity, implying he didn't show sufficient haste.

"It seems you took a number of photos. I suggest you didn't immediately make an effort to stop the environmental damage," Mr. Crocker said. "I suggest if the stopping of the damage was so pressing you didn't have time to check with the owner (before entering his land), you could have walked to where the work was being done and returned to take photos."

Mr. Harris replied: "Snapping a few pictures as I walked to the watercourse wasn't onerous. I feel that's reasonable."

The proceedings will continue October 7 in Milton.
