Ms Taha is the winner of the 2003 Padgett Business Services Scholarship.


"Zakiah has the attributes we were looking for in awarding this \$500 scholarship," said Doug Francis of the Padgett Scholarship Program.

The scholarship is for one academic year at a study institution assigned by the Rotary Foundation Trustees. The award of up to \$25,000 US is intended to help cover tuition, fees, room, board, limited language training and miscellaneous expenses.

The Ambassadorial Scholarhips Program supports the mission of the Rotary Foundation — to further international understanding and world peace.

During the study period, scholars are expected to be outstanding ambassadors of goodwill to the people of the host country through both informal and formal appearances before Rotary Clubs and other local organizations. After the study has been completed, scholars share their experiences with the people of their home countries and with the local Rotarians that sponsored them.

The 2005/06 Ambassadorial Scholarships will be awarded for study or training beginning after July 1, 2005.

Applicants must have completed at least two years of university or college course work or must have a secondary school education and have been employed in a recognized vocation for at least two years when the scholarship begins.

Local club-endorsed candidates will compete at the district level — Rotary District 7080, which stretches from Mississauga to Woodstock. One candidate will be chosen from that level.

Rotary Club members, honorary members or their descendants aren't eligible. There are no age or gender restrictions on the scholarship.
