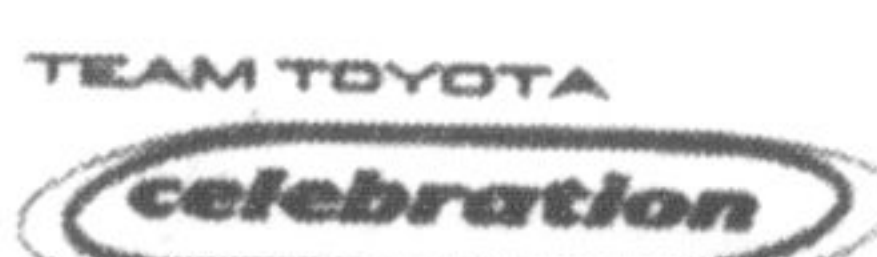

Kelso beach re-opens for swimming

Kelso Lake has once again been deemed safe for swimming.

On Thursday, the waters at Kelso Conservation Area in Milton were closed to swimmers after high bacteria levels were detected in water samples taken by the Halton Region Health Department.

Kelso Conservation Area Executive Manager Bob Harris said two water tests were done Friday and both confirmed the waters were okay again.

"There was an upstream heavy rainfall, and that's what temporarily spiked the readings," he said.

This brief closure marred Kelso's otherwise flawless track record of having safe water since 1996.

But, the closure didn't scare away those seeking relief from the heat. Conservation Halton Marketing Co-ordinator Susan O'Neil said a fair number of people still visited Kelso over the weekend, with many people coming from Mississauga and Brampton.

Ms O'Neil said Kelso has maintained its clean waters through having a bird screen installed in the beach area and encouraging improvements to land use practices upstream, such as keeping livestock away from streams.

Beaches in the area used for recreational purposes are tested on a weekly basis, or if conditions change. Kelso waters are tested every Tuesday, said Ms O'Neil.

Halton Health Promoter Sharon Little said there's a sign at Kelso Beach that states the water is tested regularly and gives a number people can call to find out if the beach is listed as safe or unsafe.

Although signs are put up to warn swimmers of high bacteria levels, Ms Little said it's not uncommon for people to ignore them and go in anyway.

According to Conservation Halton, people affected by the high bacteria could experience ear, nose and throat infections, as well as stomach upsets, skin rashes and diarrhea.

Women dies in 401 crash

A 95-year-old Toronto woman involved in a Hwy. 401 roll-over earlier this month has died.

Anna Leemta and her husband, 98-year-old Evald, were travelling eastbound July 11, east of James Snow Parkway, in a Pontiac Sunfire when the roll-over occurred. No other vehicles were involved.

Ms Leemta was air-lifted to Hamilton General Hospital with life-threatening injuries while Mr. Leemta was taken to Milton District Hospital.

Ms Leemta succumbed to her injuries at about 4:30 a.m. Friday.

Const. Paul Maudsley of Port Credit OPP said the incident is still under investigation and it isn't yet known exactly what caused the roll-over.
