

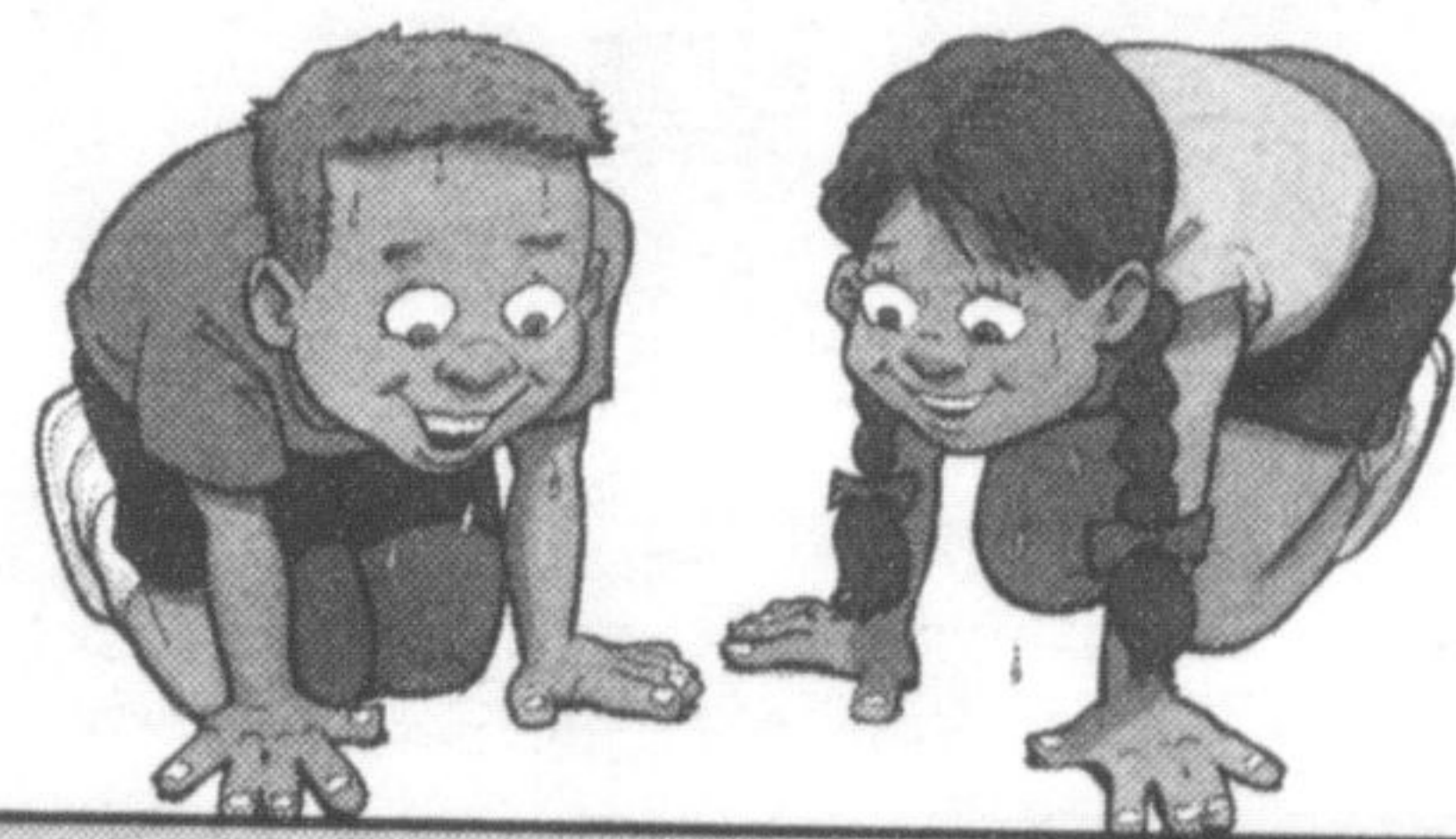

Also, he's known in Milton as Stuart Hill, according to his family.

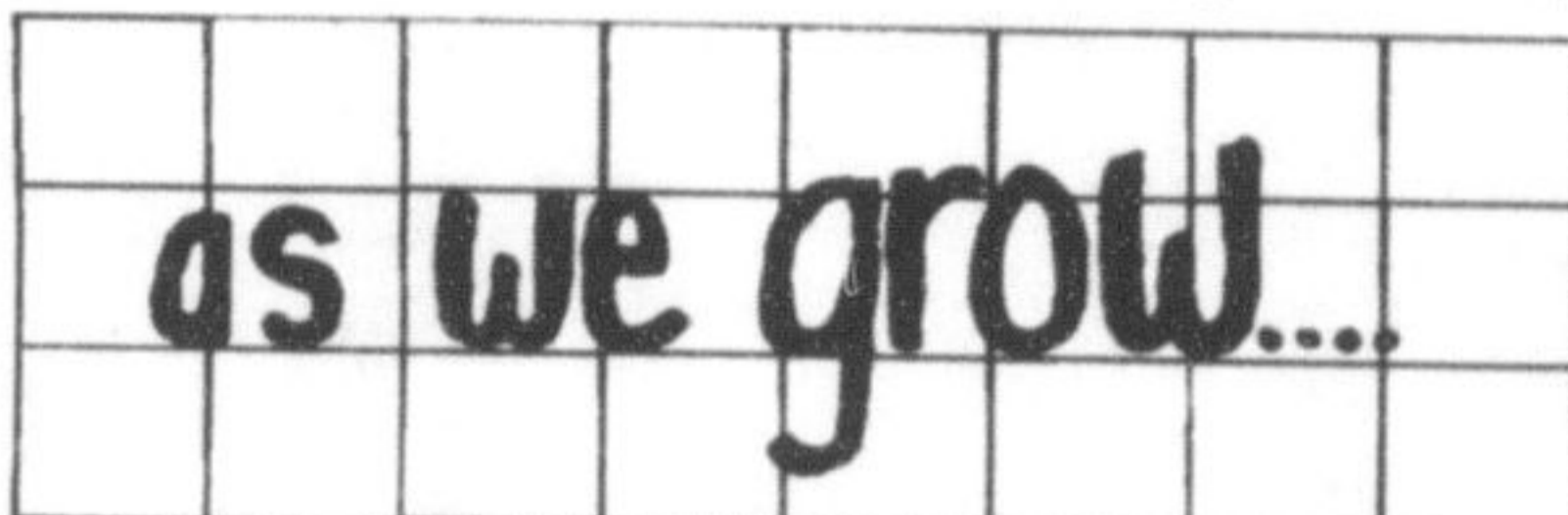

Chairman's breakfast to focus on the environment

Halton residents are invited to explore the deep sea without even getting wet September 17 at the Bell/Chairman's Breakfast on the Environment.

The event, hosted by Regional Chair Joyce Savoline, is designed to raise awareness about preserving Halton's environment and will feature author and renowned deep sea explorer Dr. Joe MacInnis as the keynote speaker.

"Dr. MacInnis, with his fascinating breadth of experience and knowledge of today's environmental pressures, is the ideal choice to kick off our new breakfast initiative," Ms Savoline said.

"Whether you're a member of Halton's corporate sector, community sector, or sim-

ply a citizen interested in preserving the environment, you will not want to miss this event."

Dr. MacInnis was the first person to dive under the North Pole, and among the first five people to view the underwater remains of the Titanic. In his speech entitled 'Leadership and the Environment — Lessons From Inside the Ocean,' Dr. MacInnis will share his perspective and insight on the world around us.

A highlight of the event will be the premier screening of a clip from director James Cameron's *Aliens of the Deep*, a 3-D Imax documentary of 40 dives made to volcanic vents of the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans, scheduled for release in January. Dr. MacInnis worked with Mr. Cameron on this film.

The event is directed by a round table of volunteers from Halton's school boards and corporate and community sectors. It's presented in partnership with the TD Friends of the Environment Foundation and supported by Bell Canada.

✓ Murder suspects in Burlington court

Two men charged with first-degree murder in the slaying of Milton resident Brian Stockton, 48, will make their next court appearance August 19 via video remand.

Halton Hills resident Michael James McDonough, 39, and Port Credit's John Kevin McClatchey, 47, appeared at Ontario Court of Justice in Burlington Thursday morning when the date was set via video from Maplehurst Detention Centre.

Mr. Stockton was found dead in a flaming car June 17 behind Traffix on Regional Road 25, north of Hwy. 401.

The two suspects were arrested the day after the murder at their homes.

✓ McQueen recognized

'For he's the jolly good fellow' is the tune Jim McQueen has been hearing much of lately, after receiving the United Way of Milton's Board of Director's Award of Appreciation to the Outstanding Volunteer 2003 last month.
