Parking Regulations

The following parking regulations are in effect in the Town of Milton.

No person shall park a vehicle...

- In any area where "No Parking Anytime" signs are displayed
- Longer than three (3) hours at any time unless otherwise posted
- On a boulevard (grass or paved); this includes the paved portion between the sidewalk and the road
- Within three metres (3 m) of a fire hydrant
- Within one metre (1 m) of a driveway
- Facing the wrong direction on the road
- On or overhanging a sidewalk
- In a manner that obstructs traffic, road repair or snow removal
- On any highway for the purpose of displaying the vehicle for sale
- In a space designated for persons with disabilities without displaying a valid disabled person's permit

Parking Considerations

- If you need parking on the street for out of town guests, driveway repairs or special functions, please contact: Engineering Services Department, Traffic and Parking Division
 Phone: 905-878-7252, ext. 2530 (8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday)
- A parking consideration only exempts the registered vehicle(s) from the three-hour parking by-law; all other parking by-laws will remain in effect.
- · Please be prepared to provide the license plate number of the vehicle to be parked on the street.
- A parking consideration will not be granted for unlicensed or immobile vehicles, commercial vehicles or school buses.
- For emergency situations after hours, you may obtain a consideration (for one night only) by calling the above number and leaving a message on the voice-mail.
- Important note: Parking Considerations are not intended for homeowners with more personal vehicles than their driveway/garage can accommodate.

Payment of Parking Tickets (8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m., Monday to Friday)

Parking Infraction Notices may be paid in person at one of the following locations:

- Town Hall: 43 Brown Street, Clerk's Division
- Engineering Services Department: 555 Industrial Drive (south entrance, second floor)

Tickets may also be paid over the phone or by mail as indicated on the back of the parking ticket.

First Attendance

If you wish to dispute a parking ticket you must discuss the offence with the First Attendance Administrator in person as follows:

- · Location: Engineering Services Department, 555 Industrial Drive (south entrance, second floor)
- First Attendance Hours: Tuesdays from 9 a.m. 12 p.m. and Thursdays from 1 4 p.m.

A dispute or setting of a trial date cannot be done at Town Hall or over the phone. If the dispute is not resolved and you wish to have the matter heard by a Justice of the Peace, you must complete a "Notice of Intention to Appeal in Court."


