

Milton Farm Craft Show to feature 135 craftspeople

Why not make this the year you get your Christmas shopping done early?

We all know people with their packages neatly wrapped and labeled by November. And although none of us would admit it, secretly we're jealous.

This year can be different, especially with a little bit of help from the Milton Farm Craft Show, being held Saturday and Sunday at Country Heritage Park, 8560 Tremaine Rd., from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day.

The 21st annual craft show will feature more than 135 juried artists and craftspeople. Objets d'arts will include pottery, clothing, jewelry, stained glass, edible treasures, iron work, wooden furniture, Christmas items, home décor, candles, leather work and more.

Those into country decorating or simply handmade quality will appreciate the large selection of items for sale, and musical entertainment will keep show-goers tapping their toes.

There will also be a large quilt display.

The beautiful location of the 88-acre park and the farm-like atmosphere will add charm to your day and visitors will be able to stroll past the park's vintage tractors and heritage buildings.

Dave Gernhart, who has been organizing the show for the past seven years, said one of the show's unique features is that it's held both indoors — in the stately Gambrel Barn — and outside.

Something else that sets it apart is dogs are permitted to accompany their owners.

He said the chosen crafters are "the best in Canada."

The show is less expensive than other large-scale craft shows, one of the reasons it attracted about 15,000 visitors last year, Mr. Gernhart said.

Tickets to the show cost \$5 for adults and children under 12 are free. Parking is free.


