Manslaughter case in court in Orillia

The Orillia man charged with manslaughter in connection with the death of a Milton dentist will return to court November 1.

Adam Holland, 21, appeared at Ontario Court of Justice in Orillia Monday to set the date.

Dr. David Dumencu, 42, was found lying unconscious with head injuries in the parking lot of an Orillia-area tavern at about 2 a.m. July 16.

He was taken to an Orillia hospital and then transferred to Toronto Western Hospital where he died July 18.

A post mortem revealed the cause of death was a blunt force head injury.

Mr. Holland was released on bail in August into the care of a relative.
