# 'Hawks net third OT win

The IceHawk are no longer unbeaten at home, but remain perfect in sudden death.

Rebounding from its first sub-par performance of the year — resulting in a 4-1 loss to the defending division champion Oakville Blades Friday night at Memorial Arena — Milton improved to 3-0 in overtime at Burlington's Central Arena Sunday evening.

Shandor Alphonso scored just 29 seconds into the extra session, stabbing in a Jeff Caister rebound to cap a three-point night and salvage a rock-solid performance by Doug Groenestege.

The 3-2 win — the second in eight days over the significantly-improved Cougars — lifted the IceHawks to 7-3 on the year, with two of the losses coming by a single goal. Not too shabby a start for a team that with several first-time Jr. A players has a much steeper learning curve ahead than its fellow conference contenders.

"We've been in every game. We

don't have the experience of Georgetown, Oakville and Hamilton, but we're capable of competing with any team," said head coach/general manager George Dupont.

Also assisting on Sunday's winner was local rookie Matt Price, who's now helped set up two overtime tallies and no doubt raised a few eyebrows with how he's fared during key ice time recently.

Nine points in 10 games certainly hasn't hurt either. Noted Dupont, "Matt's surprised me, and because of that he's getting opportunities to produce (under pressure)."

Alphonso and captain Adam Pileggi each notched their third goals of the season in regulation, while Caister figured in Pileggi's tally as well with his first of two well-placed point blasts.

Two nights earlier at Memorial, Milton was either unable or unwilling to make the physical sacrifice necessary to prevail over a team as aggressive and fundamentally-sound as Oakville.

Groenestege was sharp between

the pipes and Brett Robinson connected on a doorstep jam to erase an early deficit. Otherwise, highlights and intensity were practically non-existent.

"It was probably our worst game of the year in terms of things like jump and finishing checks," said Dupont.

Former IceHawks Ryan Angelow and Ryan Silvera stuck it to their old teammates. Silvera assisted on goals one and two, while Angelow sank a second-period insurance marker.

Milton closes out a short road trip tonight in Streetsville and returns home Friday to take on Mississauga.

**IceHawk notes:** Alphonso has figured in Milton's last five goals, going back to an assist on the September 26 OT winner against Burlington ... Former goaltender Trevor Battaglia has been brought on board as an assistant coach ... The IceHawks have traded the rights of Brett McCully to Mississauga for future considerations.

# Sr. Royals destroyed by Irish

The Royals' Division 1 growing pains reached an agonizing level Friday.

Unable to build on a credible season-opening effort against Holy Trinity, Bishop Reding's football seniors were annihilated 59-0 by the Notre Dame Irish at Burlington's Nelson Stadium.

Shouldering much of the blame for the evening massacre was head coach Joe Jurus. "When you only get one first down all game, that's bad coaching," he admitted.

BR kept things fairly respectable through the initial stages of play before a fumble opened the door to a 30-point second quarter. Making matters worse was the loss of promising halfback Chuck Allen, who looked good through the early going but missed the last three quarters with a banged up ankle.

The Irish towered over Reding physically as well as on the scoresheet.

Jurus said the onus now falls on him to start generating more offense and getting more players into the

lineup in order to give his standouts more of a rest.

Things don't get any easier for the Royals, who host powerhouse Nelson Thursday at 3:30 p.m.

Meanwhile, Milton District's Division 2 seniors improved to 2-0 with a 21-0 blanking of host Lester B. Pearson Thursday afternoon.

A potent air-strike and solid overall defense fueled the decisive victory and overshadowed another penalty-rich outing by the Mustangs. Quarterback Aaron Alston connected with Jay Price for two touchdown throws — the latter a 55-yard pass and run — while Jesse Rashotte took a shovel pass nearly 90 yards into the end-zone with about four minutes remaining.

Defensively, MD limited its hosts to five first downs — thanks in large part to strong outside containment and a pair of interceptions by corner Patrick Brisebois.

The Mustangs shouldn't have much trouble making it three in a row tomorrow afternoon, when they return home to take on Georgetown's Christ the King. Game time is 3:30 p.m.
