Top-ranked Blades stick it to IceHawks

Last-minute goal sinks Milton in spirited clash

On the plus side, the IceHawks delivered by far their most physically-impressive effort to date this season — sacrificing their bodies from start to finish and holding their own in front of both nets against arguably the most intimidating team in the league.

And holding Oakville to under two-dozen shots was certainly another positive.

Added Dupont, "I thought we outplayed them through the last two periods. It was a gutsy performance. Unfortunately they (Oakville) cheap-shoted us all game and we weren't getting the benefit of the calls."

Oakville's Michael Swinton buried a screen shot from the point with 39 seconds remaining, while fellow veteran Steven Pinizzotto scored his second of the game into an empty net at 19:57. For the IceHawks, Jason Dopaco stood out with a threepoint afternoon — sticking it to his former team by scoring early in the third and then assisting on goal-mouth scramble equalizer by Matt Price.

He also set up a first-period blueline rocket deposit by Jeff Caister, while captain Adam Pileggi scored on a big transition play midway through the second.

The emotionally-charged clash included a number of minor skirmishes and half-a-dozen player ejections.

The Blades have handed Milton its only two losses this season at Memorial Arena — something that should provide plenty of motivation when the two sides square off at the Thompson Road



barn November 28.

At home Friday, Milton exacted revenge for a recent loss in Streetsville with a 5-1 decision over the Derbys.

A two-goal night from Mike DeMarchi and some sound cage work by Doug Groenestege were about the only bright spots of a game that lacked both intensity and physicality.

Pileggi, Shandor Alphonso and Kevin Morrison rounded out the scoring. Dopaco and Stefan Legein chipped in two assists each.
