## The Study

The City of Guelph, through their consultants, Stantec Consulting Limited and Associated Engineering Ltd., has commissioned a Class Environmental Assessment (Class EA) in support of water treatment improvements for the Arkell Well/Collectors and Carter Well Supplies. Upgrades to the system must be undertaken to facilitate disinfection upgrades to ensure compliance with the new Ontario Drinking Water Regulation 170/03. In addition, the City is proactively undertaking further repairs and upgrades to maintain the reliability and security of this supply.

## The Process

The Study is being conducted in accordance with the Municipal Engineers Association's Class Environmental Assessment process. This Class EA addresses health related disinfection upgrades and does not include an increase in permitted capacities.

Representatives from the City, Stantec and Associated Engineering will be present at the PIC to answer questions and discuss comments on the study.
